# HOW BRITAIN IS MEASURED

[From the London Daily Mail.]

The August tourists of exploring instincts may encounter in remote mountainous districts of England and Wales little bands of men armed with curious looking instruments, through which they peer at the hill sides.

These gentlemen are officers of the Ordnance Survey Department, and they are preparing a new one inch map of the English and Welsh hills. When this work is completed practically every foot of England will have been measured every little stream registered, almost every tree numbered. A wonderful work is this of measuring Great Britain, and yet a work about which the general public knows little. It has, of course heard of the Ordnance Survey, which its associates vaguely with guns and maps. The title is certainly misleading. The duties of the Ordnance Survey are briefly to make a note of everything visible above the earth's surface in Great Britain and Ireland, and to show these features in maps of many different kinds and scales. The term "ordnance" is derived from the fact that during its earlier days the survey was carried out under the direction of the master general of the ordnance. Even at the present time each separate staff consists of one of His Majesty's royal engineers (known as the "perambulator") a surveyor's sapper, and a laborer. They take with them on their lonely wanderings, a theodolite and a contouring of the sides of the maze of triangles is thirty-five miles, the longest being from Scaw Fell to Slieve Donard, which measures 111 miles. The total length of the sides of the triangulation is 200,710,000 feet, or ten times the radius of the earth. Yet so carefully has this measuring of the United Kingdom been performed that when the length of the base-line on the border of Lough Foyle, in Ireland, is calculated through the series of triangles from the base on Salisbury Plain it will be found that the length differs from the

measured base by only a little more than five inches. The distance apart of the two bases is 300 miles. The largest map which the survey prepares is ten feet of map to one mile of country. The biggest in the world. It shows almost everything. Taking for instance, at random that part of Walsall containing St. Matthew's Church, the map shows the steps leading to the church together with each tree, each lamp post, the respective functions of which could not be described without embarking upon a sea of technicalities that could only be appreciated by a senior wrangler.

Suffice it that the survey is conducted by triangulation. Salisbury Plain is the base from which the triangles start, and spread away to Ireland and England, including in their meshes all the intervening islands. The average length post, each entrance and gateway, all the surrounding houses and conservatories, even the fire plugs in the streets.

The stupendous nature of this map-making will be appreciated when it is explained that practically all of the 78,000,000 acres of cultivated and uncultivated land in Great Britain is shown, altogether with carefully drawn outlines of the 520,000 farms, the 7,100,000 houses, the 2,704 miles of canals, the 1,020 miles of rivers, the 41,000 churches and the 21,000 miles of railways.

There is only one bit of the Kingdom that the Ordnance Survey has not explored. That is St. Kilda, "lone outpost of the Hebrides." Until lately the inhabitants, numbering about seventy lived in map huts. The most treasured possession on the island is a rope by which the seafaring folk clamber from their rude boats on to terra firma.

## The Record of Lynching.

Records kept for 20 years show that 3120 cases of lynching have occurred in the United States during that period. Up to August 30 of last year 101 had taken place.

## PAPER ADVANCED IN PRICE.

TORONTO, December 6.—The Canadian Paper Makers' Association met here today and decided to advance the price of news print one-eighth of a cent per pound, on account of the advance in pulp. Pulp, they say, has gone up \$5 the past few days. They say a pulp wood famine is imminent.

## MOVE AGAINST ANARCHISTS.

Berlin, Dec. 3.—As a result of pourparlers which have been exchanged between Germany and Russia on the subject of the suppression of Anarchists, circulars have been sent to the Continental powers and the United States.

## WILL ATTEND CORONATION.

VICTORIA, B. C., Dec. 3.—The steamer Tartar arrived to-night from the Orient, bringing news that suggestions are being put forward in Japan for the Crown Prince of Japan to visit England to represent Japan at the coronation of King Edward.

## SHADE TREE IN KANSAS.

During the past year 12,000 shade trees have been planted in Kansas City, mostly at the public expense. At its latest meeting the public improvements committee of the city council authorized the planting of 3800 trees along the various streets.

## STRICT NEUTRALITY.

PARIS, December 4.—Dr. Leyds the European diplomatic representative of the Boers has received a reply from the Italian government in regard to affairs in South Africa. It says that in future she will observe strict neutrality between the belligerents' Austria has as yet made no reply.

## Acres of Shooting Land.

In ten Irish counties there are advertised 667,006 acres of shootings, and the rental asked is 7885 pounds or a trifle over 2 1/2d. per acre. In the most cases, too there are mansions attached.

## Municipal Telephone System.

The municipal telephone system has just been put in operation in the city of Glasgow, Scotland. The system will comprise 20,000 subscribers, and there will be underground 16,000 miles of wire.

## HANNA GIVES \$5000.

CLEVELAND, O., Dec. 3.—Senator Hanna has given \$5,000 as his subscription to the Cleveland committee of the National McKinley Memorial Association.

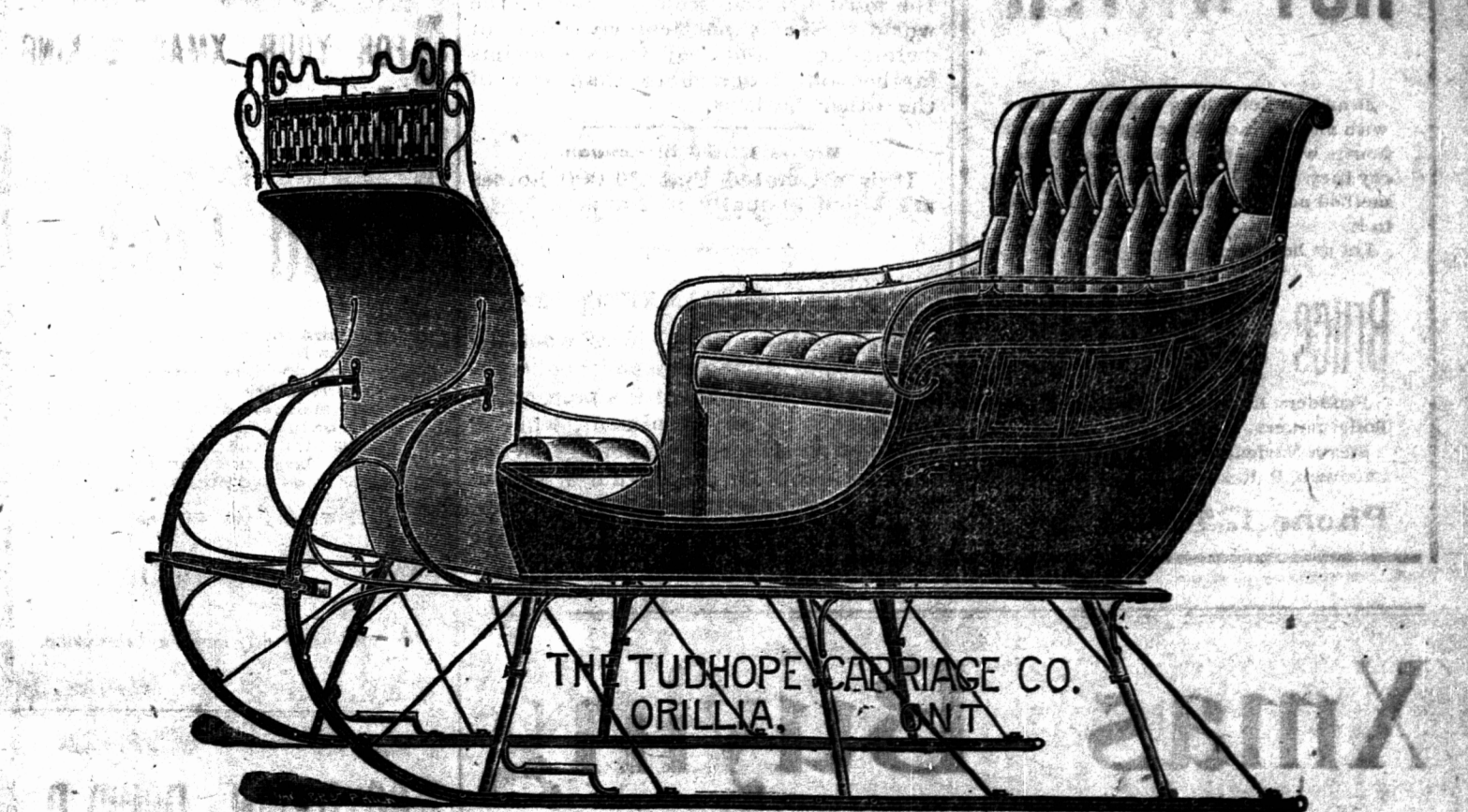
