MONTREAL, Feb. 21 (CP)—First grade Quebec butter and egg prices retreated narrowly in quiet trading on open produce markets here today. The Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Other offerings mostly were unchanged. Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 23 1/2-24 cents a pound and creamery solids for 23-23 1/2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was offered at 22 1/2 for fresh or regraded. Que. No. 1 pasteurized regraded in wholesale jobbing lots was 22 1/8-1/4. Ont. white and colored cheese brought 12 cents a pound. Graded egg shipments in used free cases sold at 25 cents a dozen for A-large, 23 for A-medium and 21-21 1/2 for A-pullets. Potatoes: N. B. No. 1 80's 1.05-1.15; N. B. No. 1 mts 90's 1.25-1.30; P. E. I. No. 1 whites 90's 1.20-1.25; Que. No. 1 whites 80's 1.10-1.15; Fla 50's in crates. Livestock

MONTREAL, Feb. 21 (CP)—Receipts on livestock markets today were 43 cattle, 320 calves, 1-2 hogs and 10 sheep and lambs. Hog prices were a shade firmer and calves were easier. There were not enough cattle and lambs to test the market. The few cattle offered sold at steady prices. Calves were from barely steady to 25 cents or more lower. The bulk of the sales were made between \$8.75 and \$9.50. A few good veals brought \$10.50 with common light veals down to \$8. Drinkers were \$5 to \$7 and grassers \$4 to \$6. Bacon hogs were \$9.75 to \$10 with the bulk at \$9.75. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium. Butchers were cut \$1.25 per hog and heavies \$2.50 per hog. Extra heavies were cut \$1.50 to \$2 per cwt. Sows were from \$7 to \$8. Light feeders sold up to \$11 per cwt. Hogs sold on rail grade, mostly \$13.75 to \$13.70 sold weight, mostly \$13.35.

FINANCE

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Editor NEW YORK, Feb. 21 (AP)—Selected stocks rallied mildly in today's market but many issues either stood still or gave ground slightly. Small fractional gains and losses were almost evenly divided at the close. The Associated Press average of 60 issues ended at yesterday's level of 49.6. It was the slowest 8-hour session in a week. Transfers totalled 465,380 shares against 609,244 the day before. The Canadian Department was generally stronger. International Nickel rallied from yesterday's session with a 1 1/2-point gain to 51 5/8 while Dome, McIntyre, Ford, Hollinger and Lake Shore all showed fractional gains. Distillers Sea-gram and Imperial Tobacco eased. Outstanding buying or selling inspiration seemed lacking in most departments. Business news was mainly colorless. A number of 1938 earnings statements coming to hand provided scant cheer for market followers. Contributing to the day's slowdown in dealings was the desire of commission house customers to keep their portfolios reasonably light over tomorrow's holiday when the stock exchange and other markets will be closed for Washington's birthday.

MONTREAL, Feb. 21 (CP)—Pound Sterling and the United States dollar were unchanged at 4.70 7/8 and 1.00 15-32 respectively on Montreal foreign exchange markets today. French francs declined narrowly to 2.66 1-16. FLOAT BOND ISSUE MONTREAL, Feb. 21 (CP)—The City Council authorized the executive committee today to float a serial bond issue totalling \$8,000,000, half of which was taken up immediately by Seaward, Hodgson and Company of Montreal, and Seagram, Harris and Bricker of Toronto. The net cost to the city was 4.32 per cent. Officials said the firms were given a 30-day option to purchase the additional \$4,000,000 worth of bonds, four per cent issues dated March 1, 1939, and maturing March 1, 1959.

MONTREAL, Feb. 21 (CP)—Mixed prices ruled on the stock market today as spasmodic buying and selling offset continued selling pressure. Ralls showed signs of rallying and National Steel Car climbed one point to 55. Dominion Steel and Coal and C. P. R., advanced slightly while Canadian Car common and preferred, gave ground. Consolidated Streeters up one point at 85 led the metals comeback. Hudson Bay Mining, Nickel and Hollinger were up fractionally but Noranda eased. Papers generally were unchanged. Dominion Bridge pushed ahead 3-4 but other construction stocks were even. Utilities backed up narrowly with Winnipeg Electric, Shawinigan, Montreal power and Power Corporation all seeking lower levels. Gatinneau Power, Bell Telephone, Brazilian and British Columbia Power showed slim improvement. Streeters up one point. Imperial Tobacco and General 170 and National Breweries 1-2 1/2. Total sales: 70,700; industrials 22,400; mines 43,300; bonds \$3,450.

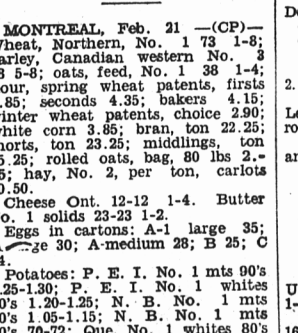
