THE STRENGTH AND ATTITUDE OF PARTIES

When the late House of Commons in the United Kingdom was elected the 479 members were divided about as follows: Liberals, 400; Unionists, 60; Socialist Labor, 27; Irish, 43. The opposition in these years made many changes, and when Parliament was again dissolved the strength of parties was approximately: Liberals, 350; Unionists, 145; Socialist Labor, 40; Irish, 44.

It will be seen that although the Liberal party had lost 34 in the elections, these seats had mostly passed to the Socialist Labor party, which had gained 27, the Irish forces remaining unchanged, while the Unionists had gained only seven. These changes did not materially weaken the Liberal party. What was lost by them was mainly gained by their ally, the Socialist Labor party, whose rise was quite apparent.

As regards the attitude of these parties in the present contest, the Liberal are practically allied with the Unionist party and with the Irish party, under promise to give the latter home rule for Ireland. But the Irish party is not friendly to the Government's proposed taxes on the liquor traffic and its educational policy. The Labor party demands the abolition of the House of Lords, and also that the unemployed shall be given employment by the state.

The Liberal demand the abolition of the veto power in the House of Lords, but are not committed to the abolition of that Chamber. The proposed Ministry policy is to reform the House of Lords, but still leave them power to refer any measure to the House.

The Hon. Lieutenant-Governor Mackinnon Premier Hazard and Hon. John Richards in their addresses at the opening of the Poultry Show all recognized the great importance of the poultry industry in this Province. The show is a splendid one, and deserves commendation from the highest in the land. It is due to Governor Mackinnon to say that during his term of office he has taken especial interest in encouraging our agricultural, dairying and live stock interests in many ways.
