RUSSIA'S TROUBLES.

Russia has had trouble on various seas and on land as well since the war broke out. Her Port Arthur fleet met trouble and disaster at the beginning of the war. At that time her Baltic fleet was frozen in and her Vladivostok squadron also. Later when Makaroff ventured out on the Yellow Sea he and his flag-ship were sent to the bottom. Since then Admiral Shirogoff has been chased all over the Sea of Japan and back to Vladivostok.

The Russian volunteer fleet on the Red Sea where it was making war upon neutrals has been diplomatically held up by Great Britain, compelled to release its so-called prizes and is put out of commission. The Baltic fleet is not yet ready to move. The Black Sea fleet chafes behind the closed gate of the Dardanelles. Never in history was a great naval power thus paralysed.

And in the meantime the vast armies of the Czar are either unable to reach the seat of war, or are beaten in every one of a succession of battles, or shut up and besieged as at Port Arthur. Her military forces in the east have been driven out of Korea and far inland from the four hundred miles of southern and western coast of Manchuria. Her ports of Lahn and New Chwang are in possession of her enemy. Port Arthur is shut up and besieged, its fall being expected almost from day to day.
