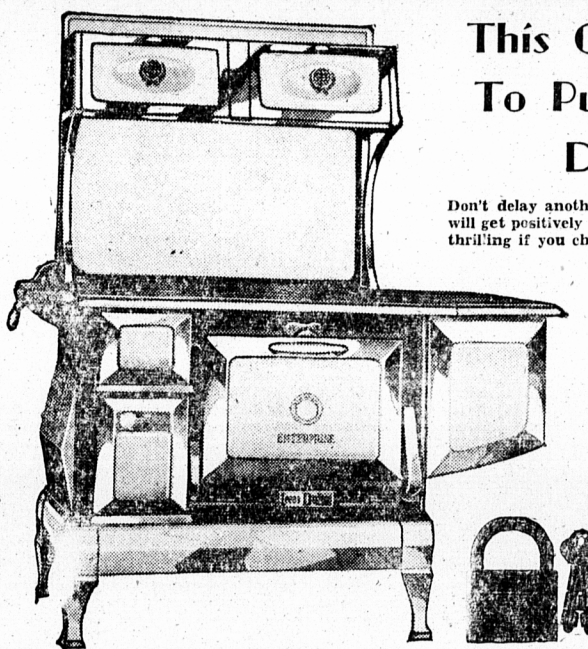

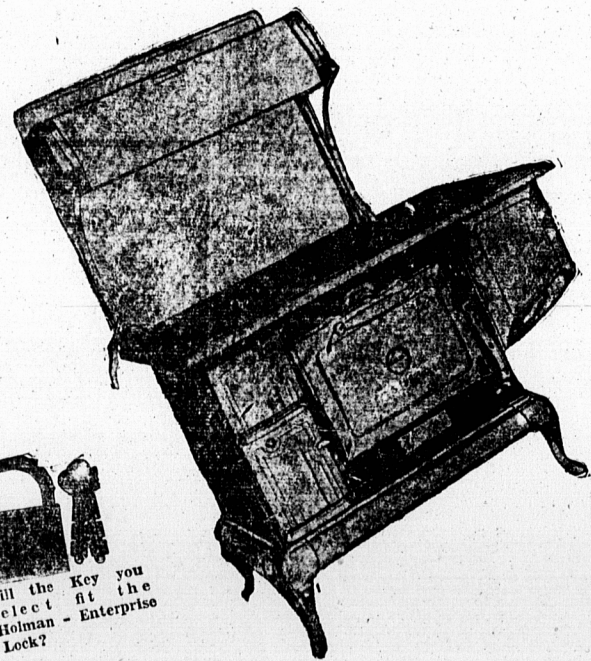
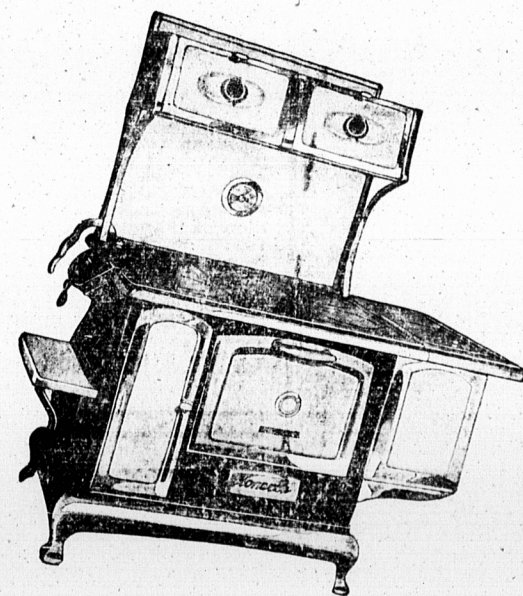

Facts and statistics are now beginning to indicate the devastating effects of the liquor traffic on the whole of our social life. Last year Canada spent \$156,000,000 on legal sale of liquor to say nothing of the illegal sale. If you were to translate these figures by comparison with the trend of business in general, you would find the following astounding facts:

In the year ending last January, Canada exported wheat and flour to the value of \$158,000,000. This is one of your major exports, but it exceeded Canada's expenditure on liquor only by two million dollars!

In 1935 Canada's total output of gold, nickel and copper equalled \$158,000,000. If we put all this mineral output into the sea, and saved the money spent on liquor we would be only two million dollars out of pocket! This wastage must repeat throughout all departments of business.

It is difficult to compute the spread of indulgence in liquor in any strata of society, but it is possible to estimate its spread approximately within the prison population.

In 1926 there were in our prisons 17,000 for indictable offences, of which number there were 10,000 prisoners for offences connected with liquor. In 1933, there were 33,000 prisoners for indictable offences, of which number 29,000 prisoners were for offences connected with liquor. In nine years there was an increase of 100% for indictable offences, but there was an increase of 184% for causes connected with liquor.

We have passed through a discouraging period with smashing defeats along legislative lines. The depression not only lessened the financial resources of temperance workers, but also brought serious political entanglements.

The churches have been affected by these political entanglements and this has confused the temperance activity of the churches.

In the recent local option contests, the dry forces have won 51 out of 73.

If there had not been the handicap of the 60 per cent. vote the drys would have 54 victories.

In 52 places where local option was in force local option has been sustained in 43.

In 6 places having government stores, the dry forces won. In 5 places there was a minority. There were 10 majorities for the drys over the fifty per cent. but less than the 60%.

In the total vote we had 55.9% of the vote. This shows the trend of the mind of the people.

There have been nine court cases. One contest, won by a majority vote was lost through a technicality. Seven out of eight cases were won by the drys and the eighth case was won on appeal.

The withdrawal of the appeal to the Privy Council on the legality of the Canada Temperance Act is a virtual acknowledgment of the Supreme Court of Canada as our supreme authority.

SMOKING

... Rev. T. DeWitt Talmage, the

popular preacher, in sermon on tobacco smoking, once said: "I might in a word give my own experience. It took ten cigars to make a sermon. I got very nervous. One day I awakened to the outrage that I was inflicting upon myself. I was about to change settlements, and a general wholesale tobacconist in Philadelphia told me if I would only come on to Philadelphia and settle, that he would all the rest of my life provide me with cigars free of charge. I said to myself: "If in these war times when cigars are so costly, and my salary so small, I smoke more than I ought to, what would I do if I had a gratuitous and unlimited supply? And then and there I quit once and forever. It made a new man of me, and though I have since then done as much hard work as any one I think I have had the best health God ever blessed a man with. A minister of religion cannot afford to smoke."

The man or the woman who smokes knows full well that he is doing something that is harming him.

Dr. Wiley, several years ago our Federal Food Expert, made the

statement: "The use of cigarettes is making inroads on the strength of the nerves of all who smoke them, especially boys of tender years, or women who smoke because they think the practice is smart. The effect may not be so bad upon people of more mature years, but not in any case, no matter how old a man or woman, is smoking helpful."

Thomas Edison, the great inventor, has done many things beneficial to this country and the whole world, and all of civilization, but he has rendered a service quite distinct in giving his opinion as concerns the harmfulness, the destructiveness, and the deadliness of the poison smoke. The opinion of a man like Edison, courageously expressed, should have its weight. People know that it comes from a man whose whole life has been given unselfishly to work and to thought on behalf of his fellow-men and the welfare of his fellow-countrymen.
