C. N. R. NOW HAS ALL NEEDED FUNDS

Money Coming in on Bonds Recently Issued in Great Britain

By today the C. N. R. from Port Arthur to Toronto will be completed and freight service inaugurated according to the statement made by Sir Donald Mann. Any financial difficulties which might have called a halt to this work have been overcome, and the road is being pushed to completion.

Sir Donald also confirmed the rumor that money was being paid on the C. N. R. bonds recently subscribed in England. It was for a time feared that the moratorium might prevent the railway from realizing on this flotation, but special arrangements have been made, it is understood, whereby funds have become available thus placing the company in a position to go ahead with any work projected in view of the recent issue guaranteed by the Dominion Government.

Sir Donald could not state positively that this was due to a temporary suspension of the moratorium with regard to this particular issue. "All that I can say is, I know that the money is being paid in," he told an interviewer.

A further statement was that he expects to have the main line of the transcontinental system of the C. N. R. completed by the end of the year. Sir Donald would make no promise when the line would be opened, but said there is nothing to cause the miscarriage of plans for the opening of Toronto-Port Arthur division on September 15, as the line is now ready with the exception of some slight ballasting between Port Arthur and North Bay.

FEDERAL HELP FOR PUBLIC FINANCES

Emergency Banking Legislation Passed Last Session Brought to Work

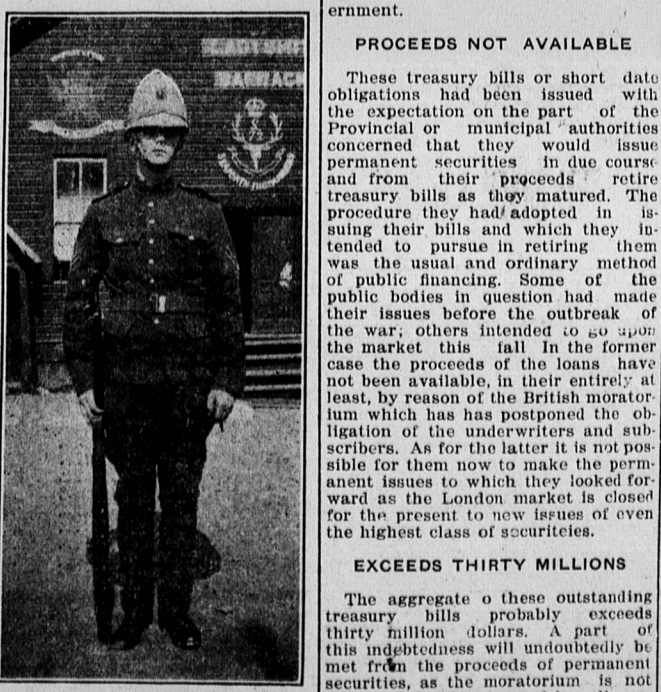
METHOD OF WORKING

Dislocation Through the War Will Be Alleviated by Government Action

OTTAWA, September 14.—The Government through the emergency banking legislation passed last session has been able to make arrangements to assist the Canadian Provinces, cities and municipalities whose finances have been dislocated by the war. This assistance will permit necessary public works to continue and should be of the greatest value in helping the unemployment problem this winter.

The legislation adopted at the last session authorizes advances in Dominion notes to banks upon approved securities. Advances will be permitted to banks on securities of Provinces, cities and municipalities whose treasury bills float in London will mature during the next few months. The bankers for any such corporation will deposit these securities in regard to the value of which there can be no question and thus secure advances from the Government.

PROCEEDS NOT AVAILABLE

These treasury bills or short date obligations had been issued with the expectation on the part of the Provincial or municipal authorities concerned that they would issue permanent securities in due course and from their proceeds retire treasury bills as they matured. The procedure they had adopted in issuing their bills and which they intended to pursue in retiring them was the usual and ordinary method of public financing. Some of the public bodies in question had made their issues before the outbreak of the war; others intended to go upon the market this fall in the former case the proceeds of the loans have not been available, in their entirety at least, by reason of the British moratorium which has postponed the obligation of the underwriters and subscribers. As for the latter it is not possible for them now to make the permanent issues to which they looked forward as the London market is closed for the present to new issues of even the highest class of securities.

EXCEEDS THIRTY MILLIONS

The aggregate of these outstanding treasury bills probably exceeds thirty million dollars. A part of this indebtedness will undoubtedly be met from the proceeds of permanent securities, as the moratorium is not being taken advantage of by all un-derwriting houses. In certain other cases the maturing bills will be renewed upon terms of reduction in amount by part payment. The balance will be taken care of by the bankers of the Provinces and municipalities interested.
