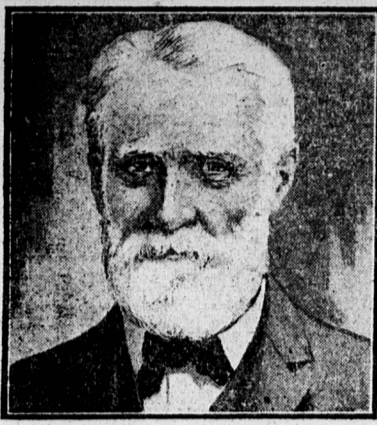

THE TRIAL OF JESUS.

Matt. 26: 57-68.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Who, when He was reviled, reviled not again."—Pet. 2: 23.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

(By Rev. D. W. Snider.)

That there are some discrepancies in the accounts which are given of the arrest and trial and condemnation of Jesus to be regulated and some contradictions to be accounted for is not so strange as would be a smooth and lightly fitting narrative. The evidence from so many sources of a story with so many sources of a with so many sharp turns and shifting scenes which has many tangles in it is much more believable than a record with everything smoothed out.

If it is kept in mind that Jesus not be put to death without condemnation from two courts of widely different composition and viewpoint—that of the Sanhedrin, whose members were inflamed with desire for the downfall and utter ruin of Jesus, and that of the Roman governor, who cared not a whit only as circumstances might compel him—much is made plain which otherwise is hard to understand.

The taking of Jesus before the Asst. veteran of corrupt high-priesthood (Annas) and the caucus to secure false witnesses and the wholly irregular proceedings before the Sanhedrin, with Caiaphas as president, and the finding of a charge that would carry the stigma of treason before the court of Caesar—all the haste, and tumult, and clamor, and ruffianly prejudice and pantomime of pious horror which mobbed Jesus from court to court is brought into light by remembering what the preceding paragraph intimates.

From it all Jesus emerges the pure and unstained One, untaught, without guile, without hypocrisy, God-like in dignity, but led as a lamb to the slaughter. Reviled, He reviled not again; suffering, He threatened not. Brother, He bore our sins in His body on the tree.

in securing the right kind of false testimony. Think of it. There was any amount of false witnessing to be had, but it was so ridiculously false it could not be acted.

could not be patched together well enough to make a case. They had to finally abandon what they thought would go. Finally and desperately Jesus was asked to incriminate Himself. And to their satisfaction, He did. But see what meaning it all puts into the words: "Who loved us and gave Himself for us."

What lines of false witnesses for Jesus are available today? Can those who reject and hate Him find them in your church and Sunday School? The Christian should bear a true testimony to Christ. Alas, that it is not wise to put the life and character of every church member in the witness box!

There is a study of deep significance in the silences of Jesus. And what is there more beautiful or supremely

dignified than the silence of the suffering or of the falsely accused? No man spoke like Jesus and none have shown the eloquence of silence more effectively than He.

When during the course of the trial He is challenged to utter the truth of His messianic claim. He spoke with startling boldness. The Man of Nazareth never concealed His claim to divinity. The philosopher says that He died like a God. Varily so, or truly Caiaphas was right when he said, "He hath spoken blasphemy."

What a day that is of which Jesus gives the awful outline! The day of judgment and Jesus the Judge! Not then will it be Jesus before Annas, or Caiaphas, or Pilate, but Annas and Caiaphas and Pilate before Jesus. No false testimony, but true. No just judgment, but just. A true revealing, a true assize, a true and final separation. Alas that many, because of the very shame and aggravated guilt of their wickedness, shall then seek that the rocks shall destroy and cover them rather than meet the just Judge.

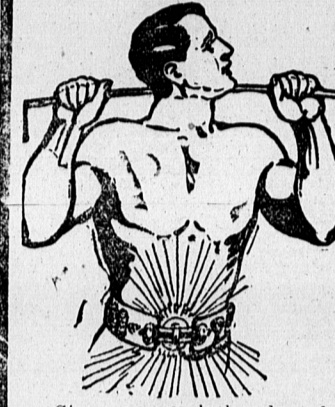
