Resolved that this House disapproves of the action of the Government in selling by private sale to the Dominion Packing Company certain surplus stock of the Government Sheep Farm, that is to say, seven fat cattle for the price of three dollars and seventy-five cents per hundred pounds, a rate far below their market value, contrary to the law and to the practice established in such cases, and involving considerable loss to this province and unfair discrimination against their parties engaged in the cattle trade.
