25,000 FRANCS EACH TO FRENCH FAMILIES

PARIS, Nov. 29.—Ninety French families were awarded 25,000 francs each by the Academie Française for their patriotic spirit in bringing large families. They were the first awards under the will of Theodor Cognac-Jay, a French philanthropist, and were presented by Raymond Poincare. The ninety families had a total of 1,222 children, of which one family had twenty children; four, nineteen each; nine, eighteen, five, sixteen; six, sixteen; twenty, fourteen; eighteen; thirteen; and ten twelve. Each family had lost two or more members in the war.

ASSISTANT BANK MANAGER ARRESTED

VANCOUVER, B. C. Nov. 29.—John Stanley Bancroft, assistant manager of a branch of the Merchants Bank of Canada here was arrested Friday night on a warrant issued by Manager A. C. Fraser, charging him with the theft of \$45,000 in Victory bonds, the property of William Day, managing director of the W. H. Day Lumber Company and placed within the bank for safe-keeping. Phil G. Evertz, broker and president of the G. Evertz Lumber Company was also arrested and charged with having conspired with Bancroft in the theft. Another warrant was sworn out by the bank charging G. Evertz with obtaining money on a false statement.

FURTHER DECLINE IN WOOL PRICE

Journal of Commerce: While the majority of Canadian wool merchants are optimistic regarding the final outcome of the market they are unanimous in their opinion that the price of Canadian fleece will see further declines during the next two months. The fact that there is a plentiful supply of wools on the market is having a tendency to bring about a general slump. Another factor is that the American mills are closed down while one or two Canadian mills are running on short time on account of lack of orders. During the past two weeks the Canadian mills have been expected several large orders from Europe and bought large stock in readiness, but to date the orders have not been received and the mill owners find the stock left on their hands at high prices.

South American wool made the greatest decline during the past two months, dropping approximately fifty per cent. Black and grey wool from South Africa is plentiful at greatly reduced prices, while the wools from England and Ireland have declined about thirty per cent.
