DR. SIMPSON'S WORDS DRAW GOLDEN STREAMS

NEW YORK, Oct 13—The Rev Dr A. B. Simpson and his co-workers with the Christian and Missionary Alliance obtained pledges of \$46,772 Sunday at the morning service in the Gospel Tabernacle in Eighth avenue, near Forty-fourth street.

This money will go to support the foreign missions and workers of the Alliance and incidentally help convert the heathen.

Dr Simpson has several times obtained larger pledges than he got Sunday, but he seemed to be well satisfied. The amount obtained, which some \$50,000 pledged at the summer conversation of the Alliance in Old Orchard, Me., last August, will bring the pledges for missionary work for the year up to nearly \$100,000.

The annual missionary offering was made at the close of the service. The moment Dr Simpson mentioned money the woman who has been the first to rush forward with her contributions every year stepped down the aisle toward the speaker. Dr Simpson saw her coming and said rather regretfully that his faithful contributor would not be the first one this year to get in her money because he had been handed \$15 before the service began.

"Sophie," for that is the name she is best known under at the Gospel Tabernacle meetings, is Mrs Sophie Litchfield. She makes a living doing housework and washing by the day. Her contribution to the support of the heathen Sunday—and she always contributes with a right good will—was \$60. Other cash contributions amounted to \$4,858, which did not include a hat full of small coins that had not been counted when the meeting was over.

The contributions ranged from 50 cents to \$7,500, the latter sum being pledged by the Nyack Training School of the Alliance. The highest individual pledge was \$7,000. Dr Simpson is a native of Cavendish.

CLAMS PLANTED BY THE MILLION

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12—Seventy-five million hard clams, varying in size from a kernel of corn to a chestnut, have been planted in Port Washington Bay the past month and it is quite probable that more will be sown before ice makes. Ebert H. Mackey and the Lewis Brothers, who are in partnership in the venture, with New York parties, are the largest planters and the next to them comes Josiah Thompson. The former expects to plant over a thousand barrels of the seed. Mr Thompson has planted three hundred barrels. Lucius Jones and John C. Allen have planted upward of a hundred barrels. The clams average about forty thousand to a barrel and are gathered at New Bedford, Mass, where there is no law restricting the taking of them below a certain size as prevails in this state.

The local planters pay \$15 a barrel for the clams and sow them on mud bottom, where they must lay three years before being marketable—Little Necks, to speak. At the end of three years, for every barrel planted, the growers expect to realize at least ten barrels that will bring from \$12 to \$15 per barrel. It doesn't require much figuring to find the immense profits the planters will realize, providing of course, the clams mature, or reach a size that will average from 2,500 to 3,000 to a barrel. The planters entertain little fear, if any, of the clams dying. The stock was in excellent condition when planted and there is little doubt that every clam will live.

THREE GORED BY AN ANGRY BULL

ST JOHN, October 12—A large bull which was brought to the city today on one of the river boats, escaped from its guardians after it had been put ashore, and, turning on a deck hand from the steamer Elaine, named Strongsberg, gored him severely. The animal then made a dash up Main street and out Millage avenue, in its course running down a young girl, daughter of Fred W. Bailey. It gored the child badly before a workman nearby interfered. Then it attacked him and he was injured before the infuriated animal was chased away. After two hours the bull was caught and tied to a telephone post until shot. A doctor was called for the Bailey girl. Strongsberg was taken to the hospital. This is the third attempt to get the bull to the butchers here. Twice before it broke loose on board and jumped overboard.
