Horticulture Notes

In our discussion of Blueberry and Cranberry growing the chief difficulty that seems to have arisen is the picking problem when the fruit shall be ready in increased quantity for harvesting.

The matter of gathering increased crops of these berries will of course be a problem but it will not be insurmountable. The more fact that this question has arisen indicates the desirability of increasing the yields of fruit; for the reason that the supposed increased difficulty has been based on the difficulty of getting the berries picked as they at present are growing in the wild state. This difficulty is so great that it is mainly responsible that these berries are neglected at present. It is so great in fact that blueberries cost as much to pick as they are worth and cranberries about half what they are worth; hence blueberries are wholly neglected except by the pickers and cranberries are regarded as offering very little encouragement. After the cost of picking is deducted. Now if these difficulties should be increased by applying culture and care to them, then the question might well be asked, how can it be profitable to expend any time and energy upon them? All of which is quite logical reasoning. It would be futile to urge men to take up Blueberry and Cranberry culture simply to provide something for someone else and nothing for themselves. But as yields are increased per unit of area, then it naturally follows that pickers can gather more fruit in less time because they get more fruit with every motion made in the gathering and have less time wasted in moving to where there are more berries. Hence that phase of the question the difficulty becomes more proportionally less, to the extent that there will be some berries left when the pickers are paid their share, and so the picking becomes easier, as it does under cultural conditions the picking problem continues to become proportionally less.

But this is all supposing that there are always available pickers

This required no less than 3,686,148 pelts of animals. The muskrat coming first with 1,955,545, the ermine 482,211, mink 156,658, skunk 130,172 and beaver 111,707. The list of animals totals 36, including the several varieties of bear, fox, etc.

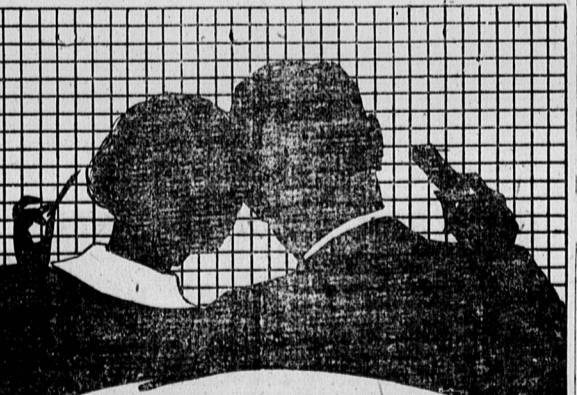

means of this scoop and thus keep the cost of picking down to a very minimum of say 25c a bushel and the same time earn sufficient wages to make the work very attractive to employees. However this tool cannot be used for the first picking of a cranberry bog, as it tears out too many vines which in later years may be no detriment as the vines need to be somewhat thinned out if the bog is in as vigorous condition as it should be. In Massachusetts ingenious inventors have developed a gasoline driven machine for picking cranberries which may eventually revolutionize the picking problem.

It has been my experience that wherever there is a crop to harvest and if it will pay competitive wages, ways and means will be found to get the harvesters. There is no hindrance in this connection for anyone who contemplated taking up this work in this Province which cannot be surmountable with proper planning and fore thought.

Packing Eggs

Boil several gallons of water in a clean vessel. Allow it to cool. Buy about 2 quarts of waterglass from the druggist. Pack the eggs in a stone jar, as large as possible. Use 1 cupful of waterglass to 10 cupfuls of water and pour over the eggs. Always obtain strictly fresh eggs.

Sunburn

Mix two parts of limewater to one part of linseed oil, beat it to the consistency of cream and apply. Vaseline or olive oil are also good remedies that are often very effective.

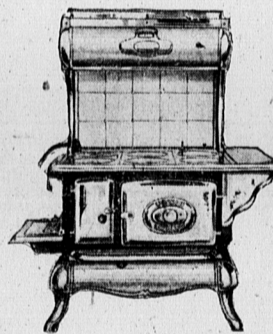

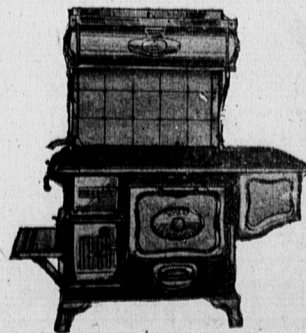

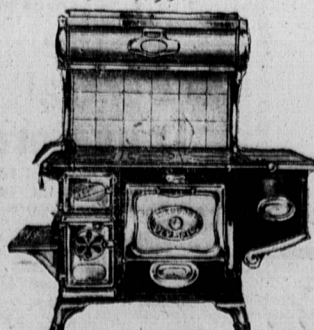
