The Tourist Association of the Pacific Coast have large and enterprising views, and no doubt having shown so literally they will reap plentifully.

At the 3rd Quarterly meeting of the Margate Circuit Methodist, which was held in Kensington on Wednesday 25th, it was unanimously agreed that the time has come to proceed to the erection of a parsonage for the circuit. It was also decided that the proper steps be taken at once to settle upon the most suitable location. When the location is settled no doubt the work will be pushed forward rapidly. The following resolution was unanimously passed and presented to David Rogers, Esq. senior member of the Board. Therefore resolved that we the members of the Quarterly Board of the Margate Circuit assembled in the Methodist Church Kensington, take this opportunity of tendering to our Brother David Rogers our heartfelt sympathy in this time of his great sorrow in the loss of his beloved partner removed so lately by death; and we would pray that God's grace may be abundantly bestowed upon our esteemed brother and his family in this hour of their great grief.

THE dimensions of the City of London, the new steamer secured for the Belfast, Crapaud, East and West Rivers river service, as announced in The Guardian a week ago, are as follows: Length 120 feet, breadth 27 feet, depth 7.8 ft length of engine room 23 ft. composite built iron frames, wooden bottom (elm wood) and iron top sides, engines, triple expansion, built by the Canadian Locomotive and Engine Company of Kingston, Ont. One return tubular boiler 11 feet long, 7 feet diameter, surface condenser, allowed 100 its working pressure. Two furnaces 7-16, new tubes in 1901. Gross tonnage 515.77, net tonnage 221.98. Draft, light 4 ft forward 6 ft aft, loaded about 6 1/2 ft. She has good passenger accommodation, 23 staterooms, large saloon finished in first class style, staterooms completely furnished; speed about 10 knots. Last year she ran between Quebec and Gaspe. It is believed will prove equal to the bill of particulars furnished by the agent it is believed she will be admirably suited for the service. She has adequate capacity for freight under deck and good gangways for handling the same. Her passenger accommodation is excellent, and can be increased by removing ten of the above mentioned staterooms, which the agent agreed to do as soon as the contract was entered into. The contract has been closed between the P. E. I. Government and the owners, The North American Transportation Company of Quebec and the boat is expected here at April 20. The ship is sheathed with steel to 18 inches below water line when loaded which will enable her to cope with the ice in spring and fall. She is valued at \$18,000. The representatives of the company W. W. Clarke, and John McQuillan rendered great aid to the Government in arriving at an agreement.

HISTORY has no parallel for this winter's misfortune in the steamer connection with Prince Edward Island. Whatever may be the sectional view in the matter of the relative merits of the eastern or western routes, the whole season's work is an occasion for regret. The financial loss resulting to shippers of Island produce is something for which there is no recompense, because all have done their best, and the same thing could, under similar conditions, occur again. It appears that the main difficulty was found in the failure to be able to have the steamers at the right point at the right time, there being several occasions on which the Tormentine Traverse route was open when both the Minto and Stanley were stuck in the pack elsewhere. It was the fortune of the editor of this paper to cross on the Stanley on her east trip. While the struggle between the forces of nature and the skill of the shipbuilder was at all times most interesting, the main thing to be observed was the inadequacy of it all. What else is open? Nothing, that we can see. There are advocates of the tunnel scheme, but its practicability may seriously be questioned. At the Amherst banquet, Mr C. R. Smallwood facetiously advised aerial navigation. When the airship comes, the Strait route should be its first place of adoption. Pending that day we doubt if anything better than what we have can be devised. Till then, we presume the question of routes will continue in the ascendant, but the best that can be hoped will be a more favorable season than that just past. A worse there cannot be.—Maritime Farmer.
