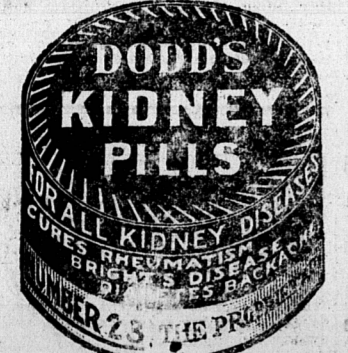

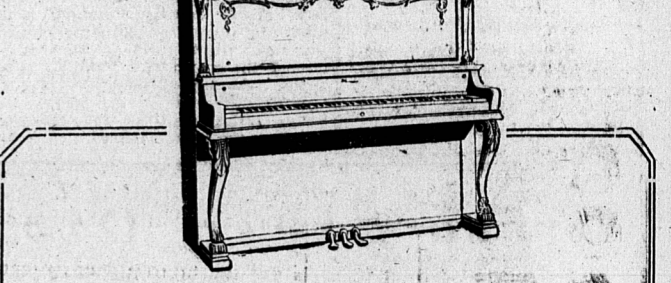

There might be another conference at any time, but what we now received was on such grounds as not to prejudice us to the amount of one cent in any future settlement. He regretted the necessity of speaking severely on the Patriot and its editor, but made an exception of Mr. McDonald in his reports of the House proceedings which had been commendably true.
