THE MARKETS

MONTREAL, Que., May 30. — A feature of the Montreal grain trade today was the increased demand from exporters and a moderate amount of business was done in no. 2 northern wheat at 121-2c per bushel. C. I. F. Montreal, over the Winnipeg May option and in no. 3 northern at 31-2c per bushel over C. I. F. Montreal, while New York exporters bought no. 3 Canadian Western barley at \$1 per bushel C. I. F. Montreal. The trade in car lots of oats was quiet owing to the somewhat limited demand from country buyers but the tone of the market was about steady in sympathy with the continued weakness in the Winnipeg cash wheat situation. The domestic market for spring wheat trades of flour was again weak and prices scored another decline of ten cents per barrel. The market was quiet. A steady feeling prevailed in the market for winter wheat flour and prices were unchanged with a small trade passing. Owing to the absence of any demand from United States buyers for millfeed at present and the fact that orders from country buyers were chiefly for small lots the undertone to the market was easier, but no actual change in prices was announced. The demand for standard grades of rolled oats was limited but values were unchanged. There was no actual change in the local egg market, prices being about steady under a fair demand for supplies. There was some trading in Ontario fresh extras in a wholesale way on the basis of 33c per dozen O B shipping points. The undertone to the potato market continued easy and a lower level is anticipated in the near future owing to the increased selling pressure on the part of country shippers. There was a steady demand for supplies for local consumption and carlots of Quebec varieties were made at 75 cents to 80 cents per bag of 90 lbs. in bulk; New Brunswick green mountains at 85 cents per bag of 90 lbs. and New Brunswick white potatoes at 75 cents to 80 cents per bag of 90 lbs. in bulk ex-track. A steady feeling prevailed in the market for imported beans at the late decline in prices noted. There was a fair demand and as supplies were ample for all requirements a moderate amount of business was done in choice white handpicked grades at \$4.10 per bushel in a jobbing way, ex store, and odd cars old at \$3.90 per bushel ex-track. Owing to the more liberal supplies of butter coming forward the falling off in the demand from both local and outside interests and the accumulation of stock on spot in first hands, an easier feeling developed in the market and prices scored a decline of 1-4 cents per lb. There was no actual change in the local cheese situation, prices being maintained with a general amount of business passing on spot. There was some demand from foreign buyers for supplies and as the prices bid were in line with exporters' views sales were made.

OTTAWA, Ont., May 30.—Reports from a number of smaller centres in Ontario today indicate that in the majority of instances the peak of production has neither been reached or passed.

TORONTO.—The local situation is unchanged. Dealers are buying from country shippers at extras 30-31; firsts 28-29; seconds 22-23; delivered, cases returned. Sales are being made in a jobbing way at extras 35-36; firsts 32-33; seconds 28-29.

EDMONTON.—There has been no change on this market but there is a slightly firmer feeling on wholesale quotations. Dealers are buying from producers at extras 25; firsts 3; seconds 17. Prices to retailers are extras 33-34; firsts 31-32; seconds 27. Receipts are normal and consumptive demand is good.

ST. JOHN.—The local egg market is quiet with receipts holding steady. Prices to country shippers are unchanged at extras 30; firsts 6; seconds 21. Selling prices, however, are slightly easier with storage packed eggs in new cases selling at 34-1-2 for extras, and 31 for firsts. Broilers are beginning to appear in the local market and are returning producers 35c dressed.

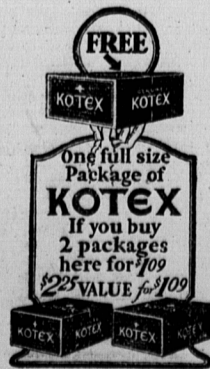
