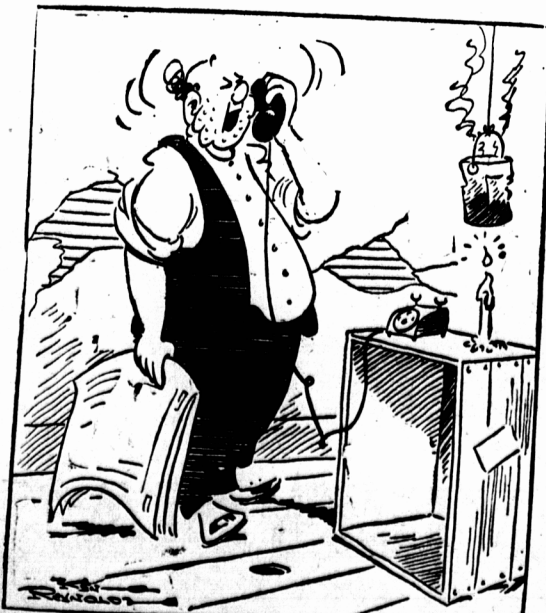

LAUGHS FOR EVERYBODY IN "THE BRIDE GOES WILD." WITH MULTI-COMEDY CAST

What happens when a playboy writer is forced to assume the obligations of a father in order to prove his respectability makes for the hilarious happenings of "The Bride Goes Wild" the M-G-M comedy-romance in which Van Johnson and June Allyson and Butch Jenkins are pitted through their paces on the Prince Edward screen.

Here is a picture that will have you laughing at the fade of the first sub-title. Johnson is the indolent and mischievous writer of children's animal stories. Miss Allyson is the prim, puritanical New England drawing teacher who has been assigned to illustrate his latest book. When she discovers the author to be more addicted to alcohol than to art she precipitates a crisis which involves the introduction into his bachelor quarters of an "enfant terrible" in the person of young Jenkins.

It is up to Van to pose as the unfortunate father. The roles offer a field day of fun for its principals, with Johnson giving an enormously amusing portrait of a man who would rather play than work, and Miss Allyson lending droil authority to her part of the upright young woman determined to set him on the straight and narrow path. The stars are given some stiff acting competition in the work of ten-year-old Butch Jenkins who, in the most hilarious part he has ever had, plays the wise if incorrigible young orphan, Danny, whose resources for tormenting his elders are limitless. You will have a difficult time, for example in forgetting how he breaks up one marriage and arranges another with the help of an army of ants.
