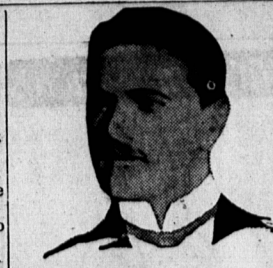
She leaves to mourn three sons, Albert of Pictou, N. S., John and Herman of this city and an adopted daughter Lyla at home.

MONTREAL, March 30.—Dominion Live Stock report. There were 225 cattle, 25 sheep and lambs, 884 hogs and 1,448 calves for sale on the two markets this morning and a half dozen or more cars were expected before noon. Trading in cattle continued slowly, yesterday and a clean up was effected but prices were from 25 to 50 cents lower.
One load of fairly good Northwest steers were sold today for \$7.00 and good cows brought from \$5.00 to \$5.50. Medium cows were \$4.00 to \$5.00 and common ones \$3.50 to \$3.75. Calves were lower. Sales of straight lots fair quality
