## INDIGNANT ARTIST SLASHED PAINTING

For the Woman's Sake He Refuses to Give Her Name—Scorns Ignorant Husband Who Presumed to Pose as a Critic.

New York, April 22.—The World publishes the following cable from Paris: "For the sake of the woman, but from no consideration for her husband, I refuse to give her name," said Theobald Chartran, the artist, to the World correspondent Friday.

Chartran spoke of the unhappy incident when, in an indignant moment, in his New York studio, he slashed the portrait of a New York woman in painting which he had exhausted his genius.

Chartran was to receive \$5,000 for the portrait, and finished it just before he left for Paris late last month. The husband, prominent in society and in business, visited the studio, examined the portrait critically, and remarked:

"A beautiful picture, but it is not my

wife."

"Who is it, then?" asked Chartran. "I do not know, but it is not my wife," was the retort. It was followed by a broad hint that, as the portrait was unsatisfactory, the price might well be less.

Chartran, with a look of scorn, walked to the canvas, picked up a knife and with quick strokes slashed the painting into ribbons.

The artist verified all these details today. He added:

"She is a most charming and beautiful woman and well known in America. I refuse to name her, but for her husband's sake. The incident is closed. It had its origin in the excessive ignorance of art of her husband, who assumed to pose as a critic of her portrait."

## ENFORCING NEW LAW IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Some Commercial Men Decide to Cancel Orders in Preference to Paying \$50—Government Determined on Enforcement.

VANCOUVER, B. C., April 22.—The law taxing commercial travellers has gone into effect, despite the protests of the big eastern wholesalers. Under instructions from the Attorney General's Department Supt. Hussey of the Provincial police has had his men out enforcing the enactment. Several travellers have been assessed \$50 each. They complained, but paid. Others who declined to pay were prosecuted.

John Hughes of the Toronto Novelty Co., was among those summoned at Victoria. He said he worked on a commis-

sion tax. He was unaware of the law and was willing to cancel all recent orders taken.

R. W. Wickens of the Wickens Publishing Co., London, England, said he, too, was unaware of the law and was willing to cancel the business done. Supt. Hussey said he did not wish to press the charge, and so withdrew it on the understanding as to cancellation. Now that publicity has been given to the legislation the Government announce that the law will be enforced. Travellers must pay or cease business, otherwise they will be prosecuted.
