WINNIPEG CITY MAY FREEZE FOR WANT OF FUEL

The Prairie Capital Requires One Hundred Cars of Coal Daily—Villagers Take Possession of Carload

WINNIPEG, January 25.—Winnipeg is threatened with a fuel famine. Harold Wilson, city fuel inspector stated yesterday that there was not enough fuel in Winnipeg to last a week. Winnipeg consumes one hundred cars of coal daily, but the dealers report that only fifty cars daily are being received.

It is impossible to secure fuel from any dealers. The city schools have wood enough to last only a couple of days and there is danger of striking them. The board of control was in session all this morning discussing the situation.

THE TELEGRAPH ON SWEETENHAM'S REBUKE TO DAVIS

Appreciates The Generous Way In Which President Roosevelt Acted

LONDON, Jan. 25.—The comment of the morning papers on the Kingston incident is well represented by the following extract from an editorial article printed in the Telegraph:

"President Roosevelt's cordial acknowledgment of the sincere gratitude felt by the British people at the humanity and good-heartedness of the United States closes the incident in the most handsome way possible, and we do not doubt that the American nation will take the same common sense view of the occurrence as is taken by their government. What happened at Kingston was between two men, not between two peoples."

In a despatch from Kingston the correspondent of the Chronicle records the extreme indignation of all classes, at Governor Sweetenham's conduct and says so much disgust is felt that the people will demand his recall.

"In every direction the government has blundered," the correspondent avers, "and is still blundering badly, while it is palpably unable to cope with the situation."

The Tribune and other papers publish telegrams from their Kingston correspondents couched in similar terms.

FIERCE LIGHT FROM MAUNA LOA NIGHT AND DAY

Fire Print Can Be Read By it 13 Miles Away

HONOLULU, Jan 25.—The volcano of Mauna Loa, on the Island of Hawaii, continues in a state of violent eruption. The light from the flames ascending from the crater is so intense that it is impossible to read fine print at a distance of 13 miles.

The flow of lava that followed the beginning of the eruption is now subsiding, but the other streams are more active. The source of the new flow is 1,000 feet below the summit of the mountain, whence it proceeds in a south-westerly direction to the sea. One rushing stream of lava has severed all communication by land between Kau and Kona. It is 25 feet in depth.

Now that there is a bright look out for the breeders of light harness and trotting horses, there will doubtless be a large number of young breeders engaged in the business and as the success of breeding depends very largely on the character of the stallion they select a word from one who has made a life long study of the subject may not come amiss. You have won some choice bred young stallions on P. E. Island, and some of them will doubtless prove successful sires of speed. And again just as surely notwithstanding their rich breeding and great individuality some of them will prove failures, and who can tell which will prove a great prize and which a blank.
