ENTOMOLOGICAL EXHIBIT,

An exhibit that elicited more than ordinary attention was that of the Entomological Branch of the Department of Agriculture conducted by Mr. S.H. Payne, Assistant field officer of the branch at Annapolis Royal, and who had spent two months in this province doing experimental work. He exhibited a variety of the most common injurious insects, and explained their manner of working on fruit and foliage, their habits and life history, also the methods of control. This exhibit is especially interesting at present as many pests, new here, have recently made their appearance and it is necessary that the best means of combating them be ascertained. A large number of farmers crowded around this exhibit all day yesterday and were particularly interested in Mr. Payne's explanations and instructions. This exhibit will be open during the remainder of the week and every farmer should see it and hear Mr. Payne's explanations.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live with a nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in its vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$2.50 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony and. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
