SCOTCH TEA CAKES  
2 cups oatmeal  
1/2 cup sugar  
2/3 teaspoon salt  
2 eggs  
1 teaspoon melted butter  
Few drops of vanilla  
Beat eggs until very light and add sugar gradually, during beating. Add other ingredients and beat again. Drop from spoon in small bits on a well greased pan. Spread in flat cakes. Bake in moderate oven 325-350 degrees about twelve minutes. Let cool in pan before removing. Makes twenty-four cakes.
