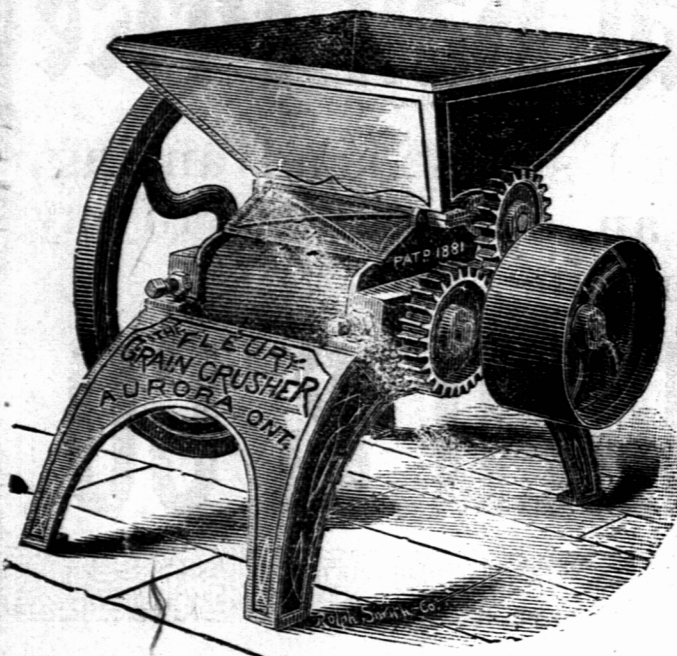

## Oliver Iselin Abandons the Cup.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Unless C. Oliver Iselin and J. Pierpont Morgan, change their minds, the Columbia will not be sent abroad this winter or next spring. It may have been their intention to have given the cup defender a sea rig and send her to the Mediterranean, but that determination, even if fully reached, has been reconsidered.

The Columbia is now dismantled and lies anchored off Hawkins' Yard, City Island. Mr Iselin, the Herald avers, has made his last American cup race, Mr Iselin with the Vigilant in 1893, with the Defender in 1895, and with the Columbia, has a record in the defense of the cup, and he feels that the responsibility for retaining it here should be borne by other yachtmen.

## Russian Finances are Strong.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 8.—The Official Messenger publishes a communication from M. de White, the Minister of Finance, refuting the current rumors of a diminution of the monetary circulation of the country.

M. de White says the total currency exceeds by 215,000,000 rubles the highest figure reached since 1892, and asserts that the amount of credit notes in circulation is 540,000,000, against which there is a gold reserve of 858,000,000.

He declares the resources of the state bank are fully adequate to enable it to give credit, and that no serious danger exists anywhere in regard to the financial situation.
