Among the aliens who took out naturalization papers last week was one man who, while he had never had the right of suffrage in the United States, wore a medal of honor for distinguished services in Uncle Sam's big navy. This man was Daniel Campbell, living at 565 Dorchester Avenue. He was born at Cape Traverse, Prince Edward Island, and came to this country in November 1895. During the Spanish-American war he served in the navy, and was one of the few enlisted men to receive medals of honor from Congress.—Boston Herald.
