The Markets New York At A Glance Exchange

NEW YORK, Jan. 25 (AP)—Stocks, falls and a wide assortment of standard issues were lower in today's Stock Market but a handful of specialties rose 1 to more than 4 points.

The three major groups in the Associated Press averages were down 1 to 2 of a point and the 60 stock total ended off 1 at 73.3.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 25 (CP)—Rye futures prices on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange made new seasonal highs today in aggressive advances influenced by upturns in the rye at Chicago. General buying was in evidence and the moderate offerings that appeared were well absorbed.

TORONTO, Jan. 25 (CP)—The Toronto Stock Market ended the week on a mildly soft note, showing index losses for both mining groups while the Western Oil finished with a gain of 70 for the day.

The gold share market was active in spots. Annuar was an afternoon feature. It traded actively on a rise to 6.05, the close at 5.90 was up cents. Buffalo-Akerite gained 20 cents.

MONTREAL, Jan. 25 (CP)—Dealings were hesitant today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. All key groups were marked down in the indices though in the over-all picture gains were noted, one loss and a large body of the issues held steady and unchanged. Market analysts said possibility of repercussions in Canada of the U. S. labor disturbances was clouding the trading outlook and had halted the upswing which set in after the recent sharp set-backs.

CHICAGO, Jan. 25 (AP)—All deliveries of wheat were at the government-imposed ceiling price of \$1.80 1-2 a bushel at times today as commission houses became good buyers of the distant contracts. It was the first time this season that the December delivery had reached the top.

Offerings of both the September and December deliveries were in fair volume at the maximum prices.

A BY-LAW TO REGULATE AND COMPEL THE REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE OFF THE SIDEWALKS

"It shall be the duty of every tenant or occupier of any premises in the City, or in case there be no tenant, then of the owner of such premises to keep such portion of any public walk as shall be immediately in front of such premises free from snow at all times except that it shall be sufficient to have the same free from snow four hours after the ceasing of any snow storm, if such ceases in the daytime, or if in nighttime then before ten o'clock in the day time following; and further to keep such portion of public walk free from ice at all reasonable times, otherwise to cover the same with sand, ashes or other material sufficient to give safe footing."

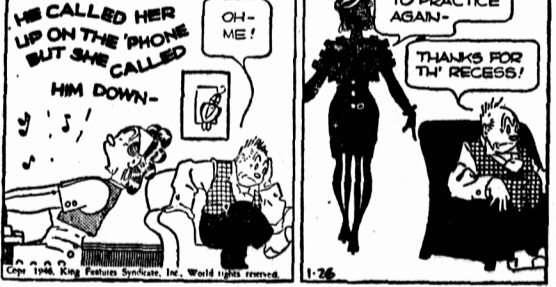

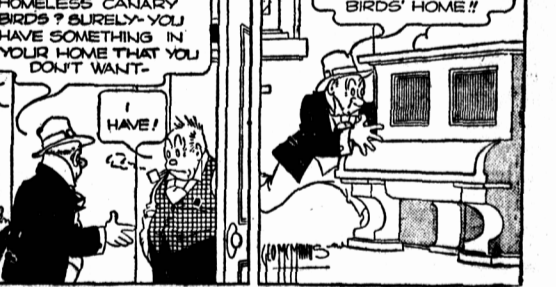

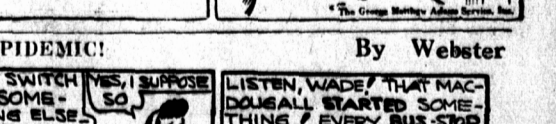
