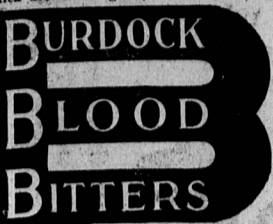

GROWING LETTUCE.

With lettuce forming the base of most salads, and this course now considered essential at all times, this common vegetable receives more prominence in the cold days, a short row at one side of the garden was put in early in the spring, and, when that was all gone, or almost bitter, there was nothing more. In the modern garden there is little excuse for running out of this store of vitamins. The earliest lettuce is the leaf type, Grand Rapids is the popular variety maturing quickly, attaining large size, and being crisp and tender. Next will come the first crop of head lettuce, grown from plants that have been started indoors and later transplanted outside. When transplanting these, many commercial gardeners have found that growth is hastened and the shock of moving lessened by putting in a pinch of nitrate of soda with each plant. Two of the best of the head type are the Big Boston, and New York. Two or three crops of head lettuce can be taken off, if plantings are spread over several weeks in the Spring, and the crop is thinned well and hastened along with nitrate. By the 1st of July, when the weather usually turns warm, the first of the lettuce crops will begin to turn bitter or go to seed. This is where the Cos or Cosley lettuce comes in. It is a different type from the head and leaf sorts, producing long rather narrow erect leaves that tend to fold over each other and enclose and blanch the heart. This tendency is readily increased by loosely ty-

Livestock Report (Canadian Press)

MONTEAL, April 25.—Fresh receipts of live stock for today's markets amounted to 87 cattle, 687 hogs and 26 calves. The cattle were made up of one good steer from Western Ontario, the balance canner cows from the Eastern townships. Prices were unchanged.

There was not enough calves offered to establish a price. Quotations were from \$7.00 to \$8.50, for medium quality hogs.

Hogs were stronger. Buyers were active and mixed loads of very ordinary quality hogs were sold for \$10.25 flat, with straight lots of good in quality hogs quoted a shade higher generally, \$10.45. Sows were plentiful and sales ranged from \$7.50 to \$8.50.

EXCELLENT STEAMER — The S. S. "Bochum", which has been lying in the stream the past few days, docked at the Railway Wharf yesterday afternoon, and will begin discharging her cargo of salt today. It is the first ship of the newly installed Canada service, with a carrying capacity of 9760 tons, carrying a crew of fifty eight men and accommodation for twelve passengers. The steamer is equipped with wireless, direction finder and submarine signal. Her cargo consists of 550 tons of salt for this port and 3,400 tons for Montreal.
