ing up of interest in the rural life of many communities in this province. If, added to that renewing and growing force, we have the full support of all the clergymen of this province we may count that the sum-total will be such that it will take a very few years to bring about a wonderful change in conditions throughout this province. We need, as one of the essential features of improvement in this country, a brightening of the life of the rural community and not a darkening. He could remember the time, looking back over forty years, when there were communities full of activity, but the interest in life in those communities was not kept up from one cause or another. Life grew duller and duller, the young people went away and each adventurous one went away left the community poorer, until a day arrived when, in a school, in a certain locality which he had in mind, in which there had been at one time sixty scholars, the number had fallen to one-third of that. Life was so dull, indeed, that it was almost a sin to laugh on Sunday.

It was a crime to cross the boundary line visiting neighbors on Sunday, and even the number of books allowed to be read was very limited. It was a crime to play a game of cards, and a greater crime to dance. We look back on those conditions now and wonder that they could have existed so short a time ago in this province. Yet it was so. We know now that a very important part of life and moral training is that children should find away and each adventurous one went away left the community poorer, until a day arrived when, in a school, in a certain locality which he had in mind, in which there had been at one time sixty scholars, the number had fallen to one-third of that.
