KINGSTON, Ont., Nov. 8.—George Zeigler, an insurance agent, took his life after having fled to prevent arrest for forgery. He was found this morning lying in a shed beside a house in Barriefield, with a revolver beside him. Two wounds were in his side. On Monday last he tried to discount a note endorsed by two leading citizens. They were asked if they had signed the note, and said it was a forgery. Then the discovery was made that a note previously discounted was a forgery.

As he failed to rectify the matter, a warrant was issued, but Zeigler had fled. He was absent all Tuesday and Wednesday, and this morning his body was found. He was quite popular as a business man. Lately he had been drinking and it is supposed the criminal act was done while intoxicated. His father was found drowned at Lake Ontario Park several years ago. Zeigler began his career as a printer, which he followed until seven or eight years ago, when he went into the insurance and real estate business. He was married, was an Oddfellow and a Forester.

### KING OF SPAIN HUNTING ALONE

MADRID, Nov. 9.—For the first time since their marriage the King and Queen of Spain are about to be parted. King Alfonso going along on a shooting expedition into Andalusia. This, as is well known, is due to the fact that Queen Victoria is expecting a visit from the "stock." She has also been absolutely forbidden any more motoring at present. Her mother, Princess Beatrice of Hattenburg, will come to Spain soon for a prolonged stay.

The Queen gets on famously with her mother-in-law, the Dowager Queen, who has not only completely effaced herself, but has won the warm affection of the young Queen by her disinterested devotion, especially her influence in enforcing the Queen's wishes in the matter of changes in the royal palace, which other members of the Royal family rather resented.

### SEALING SCHOONERS FROM BERING SEA

VICTORIA, November 9.—Three sealing schooners arrived yesterday—the Markland, Capt. George Hester, with 600 skins; Ida Rita, Capt. Brown, with 202; and Dora Steward, Capt. McKiel, with 373. The first two vessels did not hunt in the spring season and the Dora Steward took but 9 skins on her earlier cruise. Three schooners are still to arrive—the Umbria, Captain Bickstead, which has 800 skins, Libbie, Capt. W. Hester, and Allie L. Algan, Capt. D. B. Macaulay. All have been reported. The Umbria is the top-liner of the fleet, having taken 1130 skins during the season. She had a large crew carrying eighteen canoes. The lowest catch is that of the Ida Rita with 202 skins. The season's catch will total about 10,000 skins, which will probably bring over \$300,000 on the London market. There were seventeen vessels hunting this season, one less than the fleet of last year. The average per schooner is lower, being about 500 skins to the vessel.
