WILLIAMS PAID DEATH PENALTY FOR HIS CRIME

Ellis Springs Trap at 12.01.55 a.m. as Dean Recites Lord's Prayer--Fully Penitent--Several Hundred Gather in Front of Jail

FREDERICTON, April 23.—Harry D. Williams, convicted of the murder of his two half-sisters Cynthia, 14, and Neola Foster, 10 at Roseville in November last, was hanged at 12.01.55 o'clock this morning in a barn near the jail yard in Fredericton. His nerve never broke and he went to the gallows with the same stolid demeanour that he showed throughout his trial, saying as his hands were strapped behind him, "I place my trust in Him. He has carried me through so far. I can do nothing for myself."

He shook hands with his guards and Very Rev. Dean Neales, who was his spiritual adviser, and as he passed through the corridor on his way to the death cell, the scaffold, smiled and said goodbye to newspaper men and other bystanders. His display of nerve was wonderful and he never flinched.

Dean Charles Pealm, Charles Sterling and Alex Murray, the guards walked beside the prisoner while Dean Neales commenced the recitation of Psalm xlii, "The Lord is my shepherd."

They passed through the corridor and through the jail yard, about ten feet, to a barn. They went inside and climbed one story to the left where the execution was held.

As Dean Neales completed the recitation of the Lord's Prayer at 12.02 o'clock the men sprang and 12 minutes later Williams was pronounced dead by Dr. Allan Sterling. Dr. B. M. Dougan, croaker of Harvey Station and Dr. L. A. Violette, M. L. A. of St. Leonard's also viewed the body with the coroner's jury. The body was taken by D. McAdam, undertaker and interment was in the Rural Cemetery before dawn.

The only witnesses to the execution with the exception of the Hangman, Dean Neales and the guards, were a jury consisting of Warden John M. Christie, Ald. Bright; Peter McFarlane of Nashwaak; Coun. J. F. Doherty of Springhill; Ald. W. L. Jennings; Thomas Davidson, Edward Hall and James Hawthorne.

Hangman Ellis was dressed in a Prince Albert coat, gray striped trousers, black tie and wing collar.

Looks At Witnesses When he was placed on the trap and as Ellis pulled the black hat over his head, Williams turned around to look at the jurors and others who were gathered.

Very Rev. Dean Neales expressed the opinion that Williams went to his death fully penitent. He said that Williams told him some days ago that no man in the city of Fredericton had more to be thankful for than he had.

As the body had been cut down it was viewed by the coroner's jury, who soon afterwards returned the formal verdict, and a short time later the body was taken to a local cemetery and buried.

While the execution was being carried out a crowd of about a hundred people congregated in front of the jail.

New hinges had been placed on the trap of the gallows. Williams had been eating heavy meals yesterday, but was somewhat more restless than usual when he retired Tuesday night.

After the Salvation Army had conducted their last service in his cell. As they left, some of the women kissed him and said goodbye; he asked them not to say good-bye—just good-night. During the night he had a sound sleep.

Senator Asks Cut in Commons' Size

OTTAWA, April 23.—Reduction in the membership of the House of Commons is sought in a petition to His Majesty, of which notice was given in the Senate yesterday by Senator Lynch Staunton. He suggests that the representation from Quebec, which is a fixed factor on which Dominion representation from the rest of the country is based, be reduced from 65 to 50, so that the unit, or representation could be reduced all over the country.

No Action Against Boy Who Killed His Brutal Father

EDMONTON, April 23.—The Attorney General's Department will take no further action in the case of Harold Braun, the 13 year old boy now being held at Didsbury after the killing of his father, until after the coroner's inquest, which has been set for Friday. Officials of the Department are of the opinion that if the facts brought out at the inquest are as now stated, it will be found to have been a case of justifiable homicide, but that a formal charge may then be laid against the boy in order to give him full discharge.

First Ship Up Gets Big Welcome

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, April 23.—Navigation between Montreal and Trans-Atlantic ports opened officially yesterday when the White Star cattle boat "Welshman" entered the harbor. With sirens from tugs and launches in the harbor blowing a welcome and escorted by two tug boats, the vessel was ushered into her berth and was officially welcomed by representatives of the harbor commissioners and officials of the White Star Line, who went on board and greeted her commander, Captain W. H. Rellerson. He was not eligible for the gold headed cane awarded the Master of the first vessel to reach port, after having crossed the Atlantic direct.

Radio is Heard At 9000 Miles

CHICAGO, April 23.—The Chicago Daily News announced today that its radio station, WMAQ, had been heard 9,000 miles away, in Australia, last Thursday morning, and that the radio waves had spanned the distance in one-twentieth of a second. A cablegram stated that hundreds of persons in Australia had good reception.

"Salt Air" Resort Destroyed by Fire

(Canadian Press) SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, April 23.—The nationally known "salt air" resort on the shore of Great Salt Lake, twenty miles west of here was gutted by fire and the damage is estimated at upward of \$600,000. The flames started and spread by a 25 mile wind and spread rapidly.

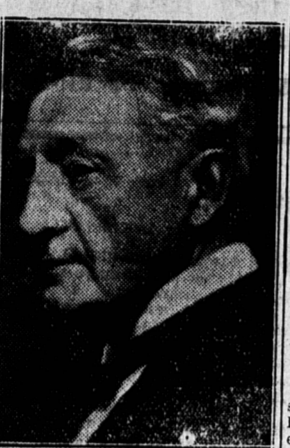
The "Originals" Hold Dinner

Collins' Body is Free From Tomb

(Canadian Press) CAVE CITY, Ky., April 23.—Floyd Collins' body today was freed from the underground trap where he met a slow death two months ago while the nation vainly prayed and feverishly waited for the word that did not come, that he had been saved alive. Late yesterday men engaged in a second effort to release the body from the fastness of the cave, succeeded in tunnelling under the huge limestone rock in the path of the new lateral from the seventy foot level and came upon the body. Instead of encountering a mammoth rock supposed to be pinning the body, they found a stone of but 75 to 100 pounds weight across his ankles.

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, April 23.—Having testified the end of justice for his part, together with Peter Smith, former Provincial Treasurer in connection with Ontario's government bonds scandals, Aemilius Jarvis' prominent Toronto financier and yachtman was early this morning released from the Municipal jail farm at Lambton, near this city, on expiry of his sentence of six months imprisonment imposed upon him by Chief Justice Meredith last October.

Discovered by police, he refused to surrender, they declare, and was shot down.

Presbyterians Issue New Paper

TORONTO, April 23.—The first number of the Bulletin, the temporary official organ of the continuing Presbyterian Church in Canada, was issued on Saturday. It is in four page form. The Editor is Rev. J. D. Cunningham, D.D., of Welland, with Miss M. C. G. Fraser, of Toronto, as assistant. The new paper bears the crest of the Presbyterian Church, the Burning Bush, with the triumphant motto "No Tamen Consumebatur."

"Surely the first note of any message must be that of thankfulness to God that the days of doubt," says the editor in his Foreword. "The people have spoken and they have spoken with no uncertain voice. They have said: 'The Presbyterian Church shall continue. Let the church that our fathers gave us be maintained for us and our children and our children's children.'"

"The voice of them who have spoken is not the voice of a remnant. It is the voice of a great people. Let the theorist theorize as he will about the legality, entity and historic continuity of the Presbyterian Church. The unsalvageable fact is that the Presbyterian spirit makes the Presbyterian Church. Wherever men are determined to maintain Presbyterian traditions, to honor the great doctrinal standards of the Presbyterian faith, to preserve the principles of Presbyterian polity and practice, there and there only abides the Presbyterian Church."

Suspects Killed

BELGRADE, Jugo-Slovaks, April 23.—Three rebel members of the British Parliament who arrived today from Sofia, Bulgaria, declared that they were convicted several hundred persons were killed without trial and on the merest presumption after the bomb explosion in the cathedral in Sofia. Those who arrived were Josiah C. Wedgewood, W. MacKinder, and P. D. Malone. They were in Sofia at the time of the bomb outrage and during subsequent events.

OPINIONS ARE DIVIDED RE SINKING OF RAIFUKU MARU

Large Number of Homeric Passengers Maintain that Some Lives Might Have Been Saved By Launching Rafts; Other Passengers Differ.—Terrible Marine Disaster.—Affair is Being Fully Investigated.

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, April 23.—Passengers who arrived on the liner Homeric after seeing the Japanese freighter Raifuku Maru sink with its 38 officers and men expressed widely divergent views as to whether every possible effort had been made by the Homeric's officers to save the Japanese seamen. The Homeric docked last night after its race with death faded on Tuesday. The division among passengers was about equal, some saying that everything humanly possible had been done and that it would have been suicide to launch the Homeric's lifeboats, others stating that they believed some lives might have been saved had the boats been launched or rafts set adrift towards the sinking vessel. Captain John Roberts was given a testimonial signed by 123 out of 233 first class passengers. All persons interviewed spoke of the tragedy at which men as well as women wept unashamedly. Captain Roberts said in his forty years at sea he had never seen so terrible a marine disaster, except during the World War.

(Canadian Press) HALIFAX, April 23.—An error in transcribing the call sign in messages broadcasted by wireless from the White Star Liner Homeric at the scene of the Raifuku Maru tragedy Tuesday morning resulted in an erroneous report being circulated to effect that the Cunard Liner Tuscania was also standing helplessly by the Japanese freighter when it sank with 38 men. So far as naval wireless officers are aware the White Star Liner Homeric was the only steamer to reach the scene in time to see the Raifuku Maru sink.

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, April 23.—The Japanese Consulate General in New York is obtaining all information possible in regard to the loss of 38 lives in the sinking of the Japanese freighter Raifuku Maru off Halifax on Tuesday, H. Saito, Japanese Consul General said today. Mr. Saito assumed that officials of the Kokusai Kaisha, owners of the Raifuku Maru with the aid of the White Star Liner owners of the Homeric which arrived too late to rescue the crew are investigating the affair fully and are in consultation with the Consulate General.
