THE NAVAL GUNS.

How They Have Been Mounted and
Used by the Jackies at Ladysmith.

A great deal has been written in the
past few weeks about the invest-
ment of the lines of investment around the
town of Ladysmith, about the naval guns
of Her Majesty's ship Terrible, which
were rushed into the town at the last
moment, and are popularly supposed to
have "saved it from destruction." These
guns have been stated as being of various
calibres, ranging from three-inch up to
six-inch. As a matter of fact, they were
of two sizes, four of them being the naval
12-pounder gun, of which the Terrible car-
ries 18, and the other two being 4.7-inch
rapid fire guns, which must have been
taken from one of the second-class cruis-
ers on the South African station, as the
Terrible does not include any guns of
that calibre in her batteries.

As the methods of mounting guns on
shipboard and for use in the field are
entirely different, it was necessary to
hastily improvise some form of field
mounting for the navy guns which would
serve the purpose. For the 12-pounder
gun, which weighs 1,344 pounds, Capt.
Scott of the Terrible used a pair of heavy
waggon wheels and a stout block of timber
the timber serving as a trail. The yoke
which carries the trunnions of the
gun, was bolted securely to the
timber, which was itself
fastened to the axle of the
wheels. A shoebrake was used for taking
the recoil, the shoe being attached to the
end of the trail by a length of wire rope.
The four guns, and thus improvised, are
much more powerful weapons than the
three inch 12-pounders of the rez ula
field batteries and the horse artillery
guns, which weigh respectively 784 and
672 pounds. The former has a muzzle ve-
locity of 1,533 feet per second, whereas the
naval gun, which is a much longer
weapon, has a velocity of 2,210
feet per second. The extreme range
of the regular field guns of the artillery is
5,000 or 6,000 yards, whereas those im-
proved naval guns have a range of 8,000
yards. The 4.7-inch rapid-fire guns fire a
45-pound lyddite shell with a muzzle
velocity of 2,888 feet per second; and as its
muzzle energy is about 1,500 foot tons, it
can be seen that the question of providing
a sufficiently secure mounting to with-
stand the recoil was a serious one. Captain
Scott overcame the difficulty by using
several lengths of heavy 12 by 12 timbers.
Two of these, 16 feet in length, were placed
parallel with the axis of the gun; above the
gun were bolted two other lengths of timber,
and upon the platform thus formed it was
bolted down the baseplate of the regular
mounting. One of the guns was fired with
an elevation of 24 degrees and a range of
12,000 yards, and it was stated by an eye
witness that the effect on the platform
was scarcely perceptible.

The valuable work which has been done
by these guns is well known to the out-
side world, and while it is too much to say
that they "saved Ladysmith," there is,
no question that they served very mater-
ially to keep down the fire of the Boer
siege guns, among which there seem to be
several long calibre Canon pieces of great
range.

An interested crowd is always to be
found grouped around the exhibit of Red

at this booth of the regular work done in
the firm's warehouse in the way of weigh-
ing, packing, labelling and boxing the
packages of tea which under the Red Rose

offered for sale. A gang of boys dressed
in neat khaki uniforms are seen first
weighing the tea, then folding and filling
the lead wrappers, next packing in by
machinery, and finally labelling and box-
ing it. Various grades of tea, ranging in
price from twenty-five to sixty cents, are
being put up in pound and half-pound
packages. The deft way in which the
boys go about their work is very fascinat-
ing to watch, and Mr. Estabrooks could
not have chosen a more skillful way of ad-
vertising his teas. All the tea that is
being put up will be packed and shipped
direct from the Exhibition to fill orders
throughout New Brunswick and Nova
Scotia. Some very large orders have been
placed for this purpose by merchants who
think it will prove a good advertisement
for them. The Red Rose Tea finds a ready
sale in the Maritime Provinces and in
Quebec. Business is steadily increasing,
and the packers are obliged to hustle to
meet the demand.
