**CANADA FISHERIES
BETTER THAN EVER**

Statement of Aggregate Value of the Fisheries for
Season of 1905 Will Be the Highest Ever Pub-
lished—Big Bounty for Nova Scotia.

OTTAWA, March 27.—The annual
report of the Fisheries Department for
1905 was presented to Parliament today.
A glance at the brief reports from the
different parts of the Dominion shows
that the fishing season just closed in
December last, will even surpass the
previous one. The aggregate value of the
fisheries for the season of 1905 will
probably be the highest ever published in
the fisheries reports.
In the Maritime Provinces while the
yield of the cod family might not attain
that of 1904, the high prices now received,
especially for cod, will more than com-
pensate for the shortage in the mid-win-
ter catch of that staple fish. Mackerel
was late in coming to our coasts, and few
were captured. The Bay of Fundy
herring were as abundant as in 1904. The
lobster pack will be an average one.
The dogfish nuisance is now being
transformed into a source of revenue.
Reduction works have been established
on the coast to convert this pest into
saleable products.
The Lunenburg County Fishing Fleet
(The Gloucester of Canada) numbering
about 120 vessels did not fare as well as
last year, on the Grand Banks, showing
a shortage of over two million pounds of

deep sea fish.
Manitoba and other Western districts
will maintain its good catches as last year.
British Columbia, especially the Fraser
River District, will show one of the
largest salmon packs on record. The
halibut industry was also very profitable.
One may judge of its extent, when over
\$300,000 was paid for its railway transpor-
tation alone.
During 1902 the sea fishermen of the
Maritime Provinces received the sum
of \$17,228 in bounties. The owners
and crews of the 854 fishing vessels
received \$70,113, or nearly half of the
above total amount, while the bal-
ance \$87,114 was distributed amongst
20,078 boat shore fishermen. To cover
these amounts necessitated the pay-
ment of no less than 12,671 claims.
Eighty claims were refused payment
as being fraudulent. For the past sea-
son the Province of Nova Scotia re-
ceived nearly double the amount of
bounty paid to all the other Pro-
vinces viz \$90,236, Quebec \$33,651, New
Brunswick, \$15,110, and Prince Ed-
ward Island, \$9,178. Since its incep-
tion (1882) the sum of \$3,632,138 has
been distributed amongst the fisher-
men of the above named Provinces.

**ORDERS TO
DESTROY BOOKS**

TORONTO, March 27.—Yesterday morn-
ing at the inquiry before Magistrate
Dunsmuir, into the conspiracy charge
against Joseph Phillips, ex-president of
the York County Loan, G. R. Burt,
president of the Liszt Piano Company,
admitted that he had instructed his wife
to destroy two of the books used in the
business. In another book produced
there were pages torn out and this, Burt
said, had been done by the children.
The hearing was again concluded
abruptly as some of the York Loan books
had not arrived in court.

**AN INTERESTING
AGRICULTURAL LEST**

LONDON, March 27.—An interesting
experiment in agricultural co-operation
for the elimination of middlemen and
carriers is under consideration in Eng-
land. It is proposed to bring London
consumers into almost direct contact
with the Essex producer. Purchasing
and collecting depots are to be established
at Ongar, Dunmow, Braintree and
Chelmsford, where sorting, slaughtering
and so forth may be done more cleanly,
cheaply and efficiently than in London. A
big motor wagon will make the round of
these places every morning, bring the
produce to the main base at Ongar, and
transfer it to a bigger wagon that will
carry it to Westminster, where attractive
stalls are to display and sell the things.
