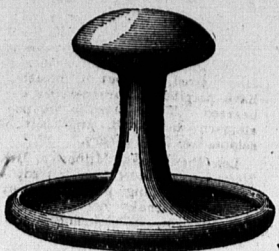

VACCINATION NOTICE

In accordance with the provisions of the Vaccination Act, 1886 the Superintendent of Vaccination for Charlottetown will be at the office of the undersigned, 178 Kent Street, on Wednesday and Saturday from 10:30 to 3:30 p. m. and 6:30 to 9 p. m.

The law requires that all unvaccinated persons of the age of three months or upwards, must be present to be vaccinated; children under twelve years of age to be brought by one of their parents or their guardian.

The charge for vaccination will be twenty-five cents for each person to be paid at the time of such vaccination.

Any person failing or neglecting to attend, or bring his or her young children at the above time and place will be subject to the fines and penalties of the Vaccination Act

Head Offices in New Prowse Block—Charlottetown.

Rev. J. A. Gordon, D. D., pastor of First Baptist Church, Montreal and father of J. P. Gordon of this City, has been requested by the faculty of the W. C. McDonald College, located in Ste. Ann de Beloram of which Dr. Robertson is president to give a course of biblical instruction in the Epistles of Paul. This will involve a syllabus of twelve lectures extending over two years.

Fishermen of this Province may be interested to learn that "The Maine law prohibits the catching or having in one's possession a lobster longer than one-half inches in length, but such laws do not exist in other States; consequently, if a fisherman or a dealer succeeds in getting his lobsters safely over the State line, he is practically safe. The commercial extinction of the lobster is as sure to result as a day is to follow night. In thirteen years there has been a decrease of more than 66 per cent. in the catch of lobsters."

An important communication which is of great interest to this Province has been received from J. A. Riddick, Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture, Ottawa by Hon. S. E. Reid, City, announcing that the department will pay the railway route, for students from Prince Edward Island, who may wish to attend the full course at the next term of the Sussex Dairy School. Each student will be required to make a bill of his railway and steamer fare in duplicate, and for ward the same to the Department they being certified by some officer of the local department. This is an important matter, and no doubt will be taken advantage of by a number of young farmers.

The extremely mild weather lately has been the subject of much talk. As a matter of fact the coldest registered so far this winter has not measured a lower temperature than 10 degrees below. The past few days however have been quite mild—the little snow which covered the street has disappeared and the green grass showing all over the City betokens the fact that Jack Frost has not yet touched with an unkind hand the vegetation on every hand around. The harbor which last week had become crowded with floating ice of varying thickness which had floated down the rivers has now become almost cleared by the influence of wind and tide and now presents an almost summerlike aspect. The winter steamers find no trouble in making quick and regular trips and the ferry boat plies regularly to Rocky Point.

In the Exchequer Court yesterday the following cases were disposed of: The King vs. Joseph Acorn. In this case judgment has been given for the defendant, Joseph Acorn, for the sum of \$1525, and interest from 1st November 1904. The offer made by the Department was \$1300, so that including interest Mr. Acorn gets some \$1760, or \$460 more than the tender made him. Messrs Warburton and Shaw for the defendant Acorn. Many friends will learn with regret of the death of Malcolm McDonald, a highly respected farmer of Little Sands, which took place December twenty-ninth, 1907. Deceased was seventy-six years of age and had been ill only a short time. He leaves to mourn a widow, two sons, Neil and John at home; and two brothers Charles C., Wood Islands; and John of this city. The funeral, which took place on December thirtieth, to the cemetery at Little Sands, was well attended.

In Prince Edward Island there were 5 failures last year with liabilities of \$43,477 and nominal assets of \$23,460. Last year there were 9 failures with liabilities of \$109,180 and in 1905 there were 8 with liabilities of \$131,986. The nominal assets in 1905 were \$47,100 and in 1906, \$52,914. So, says the Maritime Merchant, there has been a distinct improvement in the commercial situation in the Island as compared with two years previous. This must be regarded as very satisfactory. Whatever effect the conservatism of the banks may be having, it is evident that the influence is not much felt in the Island at the present time. On the contrary, the good times they have had there this year seem to have helped the merchants to make a little money.
