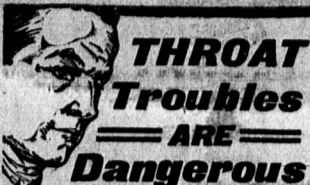

LATEST FROM THEATRES

B. F. KEITH'S UNION SQUARE THEATRE, NEW YORK.

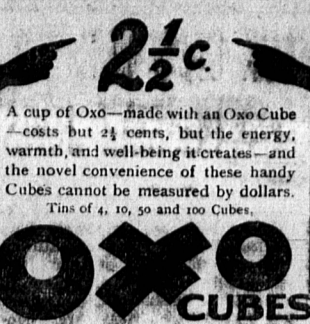
