**CHARMING MODE IN CREPE DE CHINE.**

There is an air of extreme elaboration to this charming frock in a dull raspberry pink crepe de chine which resolves itself into a very practicable simplicity upon investigation. The double width, one seam crepe is used, since that eliminates so many of the piecings and joinings incidental to the use of the narrower single-width fabrics. Over a fitted lining the bodice is arranged in bolero fashion, this all shirred over tiny cords, and drooping loosely over the fitted bodice. The smart chemise effect is a one down, separated by a loose twist of the same velvet and a plain sleeve to the low waist line, and the sides, circular in cut, and shirred to the band with a single row of stitching, some embroidery being posed in double row to simulate a flounce above the stiffened hem.




