There was only a few loads of hay and oats in the market. The former was selling at \$11 and \$12 a ton. White oats brought 33c and black oats 34c. The meat market was fairly good; beef is selling at from 4 1/2 to 6c. The poultry market upstairs was good, geese selling at 8 to 9c and turkey at from 10 1/2 to 11 c. Eggs are worth 25c. There is no change in other market produce from the last market day.

NOTWITHSTANDING the very inclement weather last night a good audience including a number of ladies was present at the Legislative Assembly Chamber to hear H. F. Wyatt, envoy from the British Navy League. Mr. Wyatt is a very pleasing speaker and held the closest attention by his able presentation of his subject. At the close of his address after brief speeches, the following resolution moved by Hon. D. Farquharson and seconded by Colonel Moore, was carried unanimously: Resolved that this meeting approve of the object of the Navy League and desire to support the formation of a branch in Charlottetown. After enrolment of names a vote of thanks was passed to Lieutenant Governor McIntyre who presided and the meeting adjourned.

Pastor Fullerton in a few complimentary words introduced the speaker. Mr. Carruthers gave a brief sketch of Hawthorne's career and literary work, characterizing the Scarlet Letter as his sermon on sin and retribution. His selections were four in number representing a like number of scenes in Hester Prynne's life. The first scene was descriptive of the branding of Hester in the Boston market place, the second that with her husband in the prison cell, the third the meeting between the husband and Hester's betrayer, and the fourth where Arthur Dimmesdale, with Hester and Pearl beside him, makes his confession. The fine elocution of the Reverend speaker not only held the rapt attention of all but powerfully moved many of his hearers. Rev. Mr. Fullerton thanked him on behalf of the Y. M. L. A. and many came forward to grasp the hand of the former pastor and thank him in person for the enjoyment he had given them.
