LYMAN W. COX PASSES AWAY AT TRURO.

HALIFAX, Sept. 6.—News which will be read with deep regret by business men throughout the province was received in Halifax yesterday, that of the death at his home in Truro, of Lyman W. Cox, of the firm of Cox and Graham, tea importers, and one of the best known, most highly respected and heartily liked commercial travellers in eastern Canada. Mr. Cox was only about 39 years of age and his friends generally were totally unprepared for what, to the members of his family, is an almost overwhelming shock.

For some weeks, it is true, he had been indisposed, but that the indisposition was serious, much less that it was likely to have a fatal outcome, none of the hundreds who knew Mr. Cox ever dreamed. It was learned, however, that two days ago he suddenly and very unexpectedly revealed symptoms of an alarming kind, growing rapidly worse thereafter.

...CAMINETTI IS FOUND GUILTY
SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 5.—Farley Drew Caminetti, son of the commissioner general of immigration, was found guilty late today on one count of the indictment charging him with violation of the Mann White Slave Act. The jury was out three hours and took eight ballots. From the first the vote stood ten to two for conviction, and finally the two recalcitrants agreed to compromise by finding a verdict of guilty on one of the four counts charged.

Bail in the sum of \$10,000 was furnished by Frank Freeman, of Wil-lows, California, and G. Bogdanoff, of San Francisco, and was ready to be filed with the United States marshal when the verdict was announced. Sentence will be pronounced on Wednesday, September 10, the day set for sentencing Maurice I. Diggs, jointly indicted with Caminetti and convicted on four counts. Exceptions to the charge of Judge Van Fleet as a whole, and in part, were taken by counsel, and a petition for an appeal will be filed, as was announced in the case of Diggs.
