In Memoriam

MRS. DOUGALD CURRIE The death occurred at Canoe Cove Monday after a year's illness of Mrs. Dougald Currie, aged 81. Her husband who was a distant relative of the late Mr. Dougald Currie, formerly a member of the Legislature, predeceased her. A son was killed on the railway out West some years ago and her daughters has also passed away. Mrs. Currie had been residing with her grandson, Mr. Dougald Currie and Mrs. Currie, at Canoe Cove.

MR. H. S. PETHICK Mr. Austin Aylward lost an outstanding citizen, a leading churchman and a fine business man in the sudden passing on Saturday of Mr. H. S. Pethick, for 13 years the manager of the Dartmouth Branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia, who has made his home in the town since his retirement Dec. 31, 1932.

News of Mr. Pethick's death will come as a shock to all his friends for he was only sick a short time at his home on Queen street. His death came at the age of 73 years. Born in Charlottetown in 1867, Mr. Pethick entered the service of the Bank of Nova Scotia in 1884. Later he transferred to the Bank of New Brunswick with which he was connected until its amalgamation with the Bank of Nova Scotia. He worked in branches of these two banks at Moncton, St. Stephen, Calais, Me. Arnprior, Ont., as manager of the Bank of New Brunswick in Westville, as a member of the staff in Saint John, Sussex, Sackville, N. B., Amherst and as manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia in Nova Scotia.

Mr. Pethick was particularly interested in the work of Christ church. He leaves his wife, one daughter, (Betty), Mrs. Joseph Notting, one sister, Mrs. Harry Mahon of Halifax, and a grandchild, William Pethick of Charlottetown. The funeral was held Monday at 2:00 with the Rev. Dr. Walsh conducting the service and interment at Mount Hermon.
