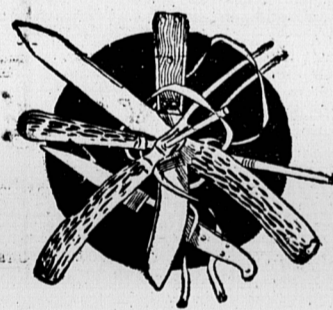

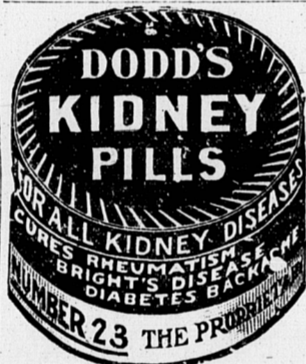

CLEVELAND, O., Nov. 11. — The evidence of five wives and two fiancées was produced by government officers to-day in the trial of Lucian Pickett, on trial in the United States Court here on the specific charge of procuring under false pretences \$1,000 from Miss Allie Greasley, a crippled woman from Springdale, Pa. One after another the women took the witness stand and told in tears how Pickett had promised to marry them, how they had given him considerable sums of money, and how, finally, he had gone away, usually after, sometimes before, the wedding. Miss Allie Greasley, nearly helpless from a spinal affliction, testified that Pickett was the only man who had ever wooed her, and that she gave him \$1,000 to establish him in business. A marriage license was issued, but the wedding did not take place. Other women, who testified, included Mrs. Ellen E. Pickett, of Albany, N. Y. Pickett says he served a term in Joliet Penitentiary for bigamy.

FATAL FIRE VISITS WEST.

INNISFAIL, Alta, Nov. 12. — The Revere House here was burned last night and two children of the Proprietor, Mr Wm Arnell were burned to death. The parents, with four other children and several guests narrowly escaped.

Ethel Arnell, who perished, could have saved herself by jumping from the window,—but learning that her brother had not been taken out, she went back to get him and both perished. Mrs Arnell saved three children by throwing them to the firemen from the second story window.

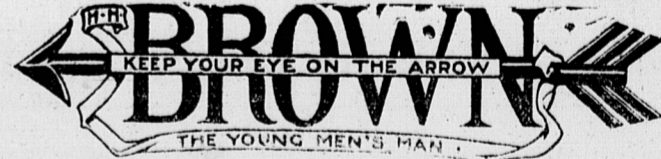
