Archdeacon White preached an appropriate and very eloquent sermon to a congregation which filled the sacred edifice to the doors. In the afternoon Ven. Archdeacon White and Rev. Mr. Coleman conducted the service at the reopening of the church after its being painted and repaired. At the evening service at Port Hill the church again filled to overflowing and an outstanding sermon was preached by Ven. Archdeacon White. Rev. Mr. Coleman may well be justly proud of the beautiful appearance of his church and the success of the reopening services. Several members of the choir of St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, assisted at the services. The collection taken at the two Port Hill services, may be taken as an indication of the hearty support of the congregation and the great interest taken in their church amounting to the handsome sum of \$320.24.—S.
