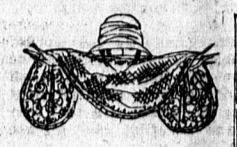

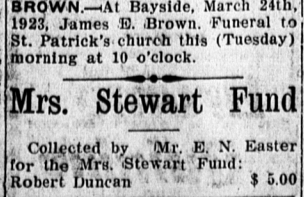

The death of Malcolm A. McLeod occurred Thursday at his home, 131 Erin street, St. John, at the age of seventy-two years. He leaves his wife, one daughter, Mrs. Howard McCordick, of St. John; two brothers, John of Vernon River, P. E. I. and Benjamin, of Montana; one sister, Mrs. Alexander Campbell of San Francisco and three grand-children. Mr. McLeod was a member of Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 24, and of the Canadian Order of Foresters. He was employed at the time of his death with the harbor department of the city.

QUEST OF HONOR IS HOLSTEIN COW

The town of Agassiz in British Columbia recently paid its respects to the world's greatest butter producer, Agassiz's Mrs. Echo, by toasting her with her own milk at a banquet given in her honor. The dinner was held in the loft of the Experimental Farm dairy barn

at Agassiz, and the wonder cow was led proudly between the rows of tables. The least concerned was May Echo herself when the 300 guests rose to the toast of the Queen of Cream. She had produced nearly 100 pounds of butter more than the holder of the previous record, and finished in better condition than when her year's race started.

STATION BLOWN TO SEA

LONDON, Mar. 24—Lieutenant-General Sir George Kirkpatrick received by wireless at Anchorage, Alaska, declares that wind has demolished the naval radio station on

St. Paul Island in the Bering Sea. The report came from the Steamer Starr. The naval radio station on St. Paul Island is used for relaying messages to Japan by the northern route and plays a large part in the transmission of marine intelligence.
