LOCAL BRIEFS

The Latest News of the City and Province.

Mr. R. B. Smith, formerly a prominent Moncton lawyer, has been tendered and accepted the pastorate of the McLaughlin and Baudoche Baptist churches for the ensuing year.

Fears are entertained for the safety of the Liverpool barkentine Clara E. McGillivray, out two weeks from Campbellton, C. B., for New York. The commander is Capt. Rafuse, of Liverpool, and she carries a crew of nine.

THE Alhambra skating rink is expected to be opened in about a week, when Manager C George Armstrong will be able to present to his patrons one of the finest indoor sheets of ice in the province, says a Sussex, N. B. writer, the area of which is 60x220 feet and not hampered by any posts.

About three o'clock, Tuesday morning citizens of Dorchester, N. B. were startled by the loud ringing of the English church bell for a fire in the superior School building. Not a single thing was saved from the museum room, containing the library, chemical apparatus, etc. The origin of the fire is unknown. The building was insured.

Mr. Burde te, United States commissioner of emigration, left yesterday for New Carlisle where he will examine the emigrants coming out on the steamer Gaspesia, of the new Canadian steamship company. Although the I. C. R., refused to supply vessels with freight at this port, the new company has been promised freights for three large steamers with New Carlisle as a terminus. The freight is hauled over the I. C. R., to the Atlantic and Lake Superior road, which takes it to the water front. Halifax thus gets another black eye.—Herald

A fine of forty shillings and costs was inflicted at Bristol, the other day, upon Edwin Reed for unseemly behavior in St. Simon's Church on Protestant Sunday by exclaiming, 'in the name of God I protest against this idolatry.' This was at the close of a church of England service, at which the wafer was consecrated and elevated, and the bell rung. A churchwarden turned Reed out, and there was a disorderly scene in the porch. One worshipper there said it was not a church at which Protestant Churchmen should attend; it was a happy hunting ground for the High Church party. Cross-summonses for assault were abandoned.

Two north end young ladies employed by a Holl's street firm Halifax had a thrilling experience the other day and it was the pres nce of mid of one of them that saved the lives of both. The building occupied by the firm has an elevator. The young women boarded the elevator at the top of the building. After leaving the top landing it suddenly increased in speed, and could not be checked. The situation was alarming. One of the young women, who had more self control than the other, called out to her companion to jump when the elevator touched the ground floor. The elevator rebounded when it struck, the women either jumped or were thrown off. They started to the Mail's informant that they jumped. Following the string on the bottom the huge weight overhead fell with a crash, and the bottoms of the left and flooring were torn to splinters. One of the younger women fell in a faint after her thrilling experience.

A SCHOONER FROM P. E. I. Thought to be the one Wrecked on Goose Island, N. S.

HALIFAX Dec 13—Special despatch to the ECHO received from Salmon River states that unknown schooner is ashore on Goose Island, inside of Beaver Island light.

The seas are making a clean breach over the vessel.

The steam tug Dolphine, with J. H. Witman on board, has gone out from Salmon River to the stranded schooner's assistance. Nothing is known as to the whereabouts of the crew.

The wreck is about three miles out from Salmon River. A heavy sea is running.

Boats have gone out to her, but owing to the rough weather they are unable to render any assistance.

It is thought the wreck is a schooner from P. E. Island, produce laden. The following despatch was received by John Strachan, agent of the China Mutual, this morning, from J. H. Witman, Salmon River: "A Schooner is ashore on Goose Island, inside of Beaver light. She is about seventy tons. The hull is submerged. The sea is too high at present to render assistance."
