The following are the Alberton market prices. White and black oats, thirty-seven to thirty-eight cents; a bushel; eggs twenty-one cents; a dozen; butter, eighteen to twenty cents; milk, ten cents a quart; pork eight to eight and three quarters cents a lb; and may eight to nine dollars a ton; potatoes at eighteen cents and turnips at thirteen cents.

There was quite an exciting scene at the Summerside freight shed yesterday. A trader with a large live hog, in rather a frail crate, wished to have the animal shipped out along the line. The hog after being safely landed from the truck made a dash for liberty and very soon succeeded in escaping to the street. With the assistance of a couple of dogs, after a lively chase, the animal was brought back and secured in a cage, with ropes and wires.

A sudden death occurred in Spring Valley on Oct. 25th, when Rev. Gough, the son of George Bryenton, passed peacefully away. He was three years and two months old. Death was due to pneumonia. 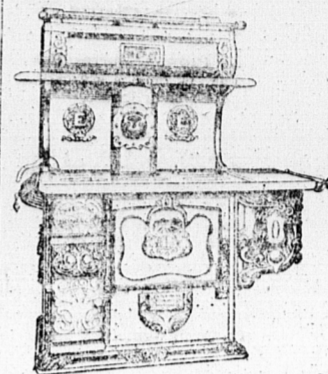
