Public Must Aid In Cancer Battle

(By The Canadian Press) TORONTO, April 9—An enlightened and aroused public is essential to a successful battle against cancer. Dr. C. C. Little of Bar Harbor, Me., said here tonight in an address.

The technical side of the problem of combating cancer was well organized, he said. The other phase of the problem—public co-operation and awareness—depended on individual qualities which any citizen interested in maintaining and developing a true conception of democracy should take a pride in possessing.

Cancer was not a typical disease, he pointed out. In its early stages it is composed of healthier and more vigorous body tissue than the rest of the body in which it occurs. If detected early and promptly and properly treated the chance of cure was often good.

Speaking to a public meeting sponsored by the Health League of Canada in co-operation with the Canadian Cancer Society, Ontario branch, and the Ontario Cancer Treatment and Research Foundation, he said early detection of cancer depends primarily on the individual.

In the above table Sulphate of Ammonia is shown as the only source of Nitrogen. In factory practice Cyanamid and Ammonium Nitrate are used in addition. These aggravate further the filler situation. When Borax or Magnesium is used the quantity of filler is highly reduced.

2-12-6 and 3-15-6 are largely used for similar crops—Grain, Hay, Turnips and Pastures. The latter contains more plant food and less other materials, resulting in a lower cost per unit for the plant food.

4-8-10 and 5-10-10 are largely used for Potatoes. The latter contains more plant food and less "other materials", resulting in a lower cost per unit for the plant food.

"Other Materials" is usually Limestone, Sand, or a mixture of both. There is a limit to the quantity of Limestone that can be safely added to Mixed Fertilizers.

Hopes For Lower Housing Costs Receive Set-back

TORONTO, April 9 — (CP)—Hopes for lower housing costs in Canada are getting a set-back by the present "warm war," according to the tenor of discussions at today's convention of the Great Lakes section of the Society of Residential Appraisers.

As J. T. Bryden, of Toronto, (assistant general manager, North American Life Assurance Co.) put it:

"You can take your choice: Will the European recovery program, United States war expenditures and tax cuts set off higher prices? Or will the recent trend towards lower prices be able to hold against developments?"

"If the warm war brings greater industrial effort, then we will see an increase in inflation pressures, controlled interest rates and more public housing."

Carl F. Distelhorst of Chicago, (director of education, American Savings and Loan Institute) commented:

"Looking ahead in these times is like looking down the receiving end of a shotgun to see if it is loaded," however:

Recent events "are of sufficient magnitude to reverse any declining business trend which might have been in the making and indeed they have in them seeds of more inflation."


"While neither the United States tax cut nor E.R.P. can definitely be considered 'in the bag' for more than a year, many plans will be made on the assumption that lower taxes and a higher level of exports will prevail for more than a year. If either or both are dropped it will probably be in deference to financing our warm war program which would be even more stim-
