Markets At A Glance

(Canadian Press)—Toronto and Montreal—Industrial stocks closed higher. New York—Stocks closed higher. Winnipeg—Wheat closed higher. New York—Cotton, high rubber and coffee lower; sugar unchanged.

LIVESTOCK

(Canadian Press)—Offerings on the two Montreal livestock markets today totalled 1,254 head. Receipts were composed of 28 cattle, 673 calves, 229 hogs and 24 sheep and lambs. There were no enough cattle for sale to make a market. Today's offerings were mostly common to just fair quality. The bulk of the sales were made between \$3 and \$8.50 for cow and calf, \$2 for culls to \$4 for real calves of medium good quality. Hog prices were steady with yesterday's quotations of \$8.40 for bacon, fed and watered, with \$1 per hog premium on select hams, lights and heavies were \$7.90 and extra heavies \$7.40. Sows were from \$5.25 to \$6.50.

PRODUCE

(Canadian Press)—MONTRÉAL, May 8—A decline in potato prices was the lone price movement on the Montreal produce and dairy market today. Quebec potatoes per 80 pound bag eased five cents to 85 to 90 cents while New Brunswick mountains per 80 pound bag were off the same amount at 90 to 95 cents. Prince Edward Island mountains dipped five to 10 cents at \$1.10 to \$1.20 per 80 pound bag. Fresh no 1 butter was unchanged at 19 1/2 to 19 3/4 cents a pound and no 2 butter sold at 18 1/2 to 19 cents a pound. Receipts were 172 boxes. Ontario cheese sold at 9 1/2 cents a pound and arrivals totalled 127 boxes. Egg receipts were also heavy, 6,075 cases arriving. Graded shipments in lots of less were firm at 19 to 19 1/2 cents for A large, 18 to 19 1/2 cents for B and 16 cents a dozen for C, western eggs selling 1 cent above the maximum of the general prices.

Currencies

(Canadian Press)—MONTRÉAL, May 8—Gains predominated among currencies on Montreal exchanges today, the pound and the French franc both recording advances while the United States dollar was off a small amount. The pound rose 1 1/2 cents at 55.10, while the franc was off a cent higher at 6.61 cents. The American dollar eased 1/16 of one cent at 51.16 of one percent discount. NEW YORK, May 8—All leading currencies advanced moderately in the foreign exchange markets today. The pound rose 1/16 of one cent near its top at 55.12 1/2, up 1 1/2 cents. The Canadian dollar extended its premium over the United States dollar from 1/4 to 5/16 percent, while the French franc, closing at 6.60 cents was up 1/16 of one cent.

GRAIN

(Canadian Press)—WINNIPEG, May 8—Hot winds across the Prairies today fanned the Winnipeg grain pit into a fever of excitement and whipped up wheat futures for their sharpest gain in six months. Future deliveries added three cents all around. May option ended at 69 1/2 cents, July at 70 1/2 and October at 71 1/2.

Riding on the crest of weather news that saddened the farmer but cheered the speculator, the market opened with a convincing flourish and wound up in a burst of strength at the day's high levels.

Lack of rain on the Canadian prairie and a soaring heat wave across part of the United States wheat belt was coupled with unfavorable crop news from Europe to provide the major stimulus for the boost. Further encouragement was supplied by news that exports of Canadian wheat amounted to 500,000 bushels.

Winnipeg's buoyant market showed the way to Chicago, which Monday had hung up spectacular gains. Finally the southern market was impressed by the display here and it ended with gains of better than a cent.

MINING

(Canadian Press)—TORONTO, May 8—Mining shares developed a buoyant note late in the day, following a morning of uncertainty, the big gold and base metal shares leading the upturn. Sentiment for the advance was fostered by finite rally on the New York market in which the metals played a prominent role. In the Toronto Exchange mine listings final gains ranged up to \$1.

Dome's declaration of a fat dividend was a factor in attracting traders to the buying side. Dome hit \$7.75 and closed at \$7.25. Lake Shore finished \$1 higher at 49.75, McIntyre \$1 up at 48.25, Wright Hargrave 90 cents up at \$0.90, Hollinger 50 up at 18.50 and Teck 20 cents up at \$1.10. Pioneer closed unchanged and Bratner down 20 at 18.25.
