Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over sixteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must set out in person the Dominion Lands; or may apply to the District Office by proxy. Land may be had: at any Dominion Lands Office; or by Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader: in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead is performed in the vicinity.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. **Duties**—Must reside six months each of three years, cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

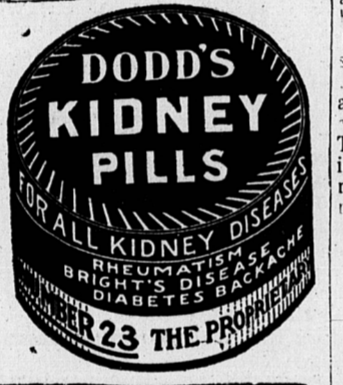

The children shown in this picture have only recently been reclaimed to Belgium. King Albert and Queen Elizabeth are shown in their midst, and to look at it one would think it was a family group, and in a sense it is, for the King and Queen of the Belgians are veritable parents not only to the children of their subjects but to their subjects themselves.

But this is not altogether a happy little group, true there are some who smile, some who can not remember any other condition. To-day lots of these children are alone in the world.

There is the case of nine year old Maria Paradise who lived in Courtrai. Father went to war and she and her mother and a baby sister were left at home. The Germans came to Courtrai, shells fell in the streets and many houses were destroyed or fell in and collapsed with the force of the concussion of the bursting missiles. The Germans seized all the food in the town and Maria and her mother for days went with nothing to eat. Then Maria's mother

KILLED IN ACTION

The following letter has been received regarding the death of Pte. Joseph Holland, who was killed in action Sept. 23rd, 1918:

France, Oct. 2nd, 1918.
Mr. Beano Holland, East Baltic, P. E. I.

DEAR SIR.—You have no doubt been advised of the death of your son, No. 2099858, Pte. Joseph Holland, who was instantly killed on Sept. 23rd, but I felt that just a few lines from one who knew your son and the splendid work he did would perhaps be a little comfort to you in your great loss.

Pte. Holland was a soldier in ever sense of the word; a true Canadian and a favorite with all who met him. He was indeed popular with officers as well as men and an example that might well be followed by any and all who would be good men and real soldiers.

At the time of his death your son was carrying on a very important duty and he died at his post; instantly killed by an enemy bullet. He rests in a soldier's grave, near men from his home land and among men who like himself have died nobly fighting for right and freedom.
