CAPT. John L. Read will have charge of the steamer Frank C. Batt, the Bedouque ferry next summer. Considerable improvement will be made on the steamer and her appearance will be somewhat changed by the upper wheel house being taken off. Under the new management there is no doubt but that the popularity of the ferry will continue to increase.

THE auditors of the school accounts, Messrs. D. K. Currie and J. S. Hinton, have found the books correct and report the work of the Secretary, Mr. W. F. Clark was very satisfactory. The total expenditure for the year amounted to \$2463.72. The enrollment of the three schools is 500. As will be seen this places the average cost of education at \$4.92 per pupil.

THE following are the officers elected at the annual meeting of the Y. M. C. A. for the ensuing year:—A. S. McKay, President; J. M. Clark, G. W. Warren, R. H. Campbell, Vice-presidents; Treasurer, J. The opening address will be given by Rev. W. H. Smith, of which due notice will be given.

THE regular monthly meeting of the Summerside School Board was held in their rooms Tuesday evening at 7:30 o'clock. All the members were present but only routine work was done. The Supervisor's Report showed that the enrollment for January was 418, the average attendance 359 and the percentage 83. The visiting committee Dr. McLellan and J. M. Clark reported that they had visited the schools during the month and had found everything in a satisfactory condition.

Fruit Growers' Meeting.

[Continued from fifth page.]

Father Burke struck a timely note in his thoughtful paper on Forestry, and a very interesting discussion followed, which was joined in by the visiting Professors of the Experimental Farms, the members of the Government and others. The lesson of the paper was to impress upon the public mind the need for the Government to adopt some practical course to preserve our beautiful and valuable forests. The paper dealt with the almost complete destruction of our woods and showed what losses we would be as a people, not only in an agricultural sense, but in a climatic, hygienic, aesthetic and commercial one as well. The influence of forests on our climate was forcibly set forth; the necessity for a proper proportion between our fields and forests in the interest of agriculture was made as clear as day, the terrible exposure of the Province to devastating winds, etc. set forth in suitable terms. The Rev. gentleman indicated the measures being employed elsewhere for the protection and extension of the forests. He called upon the Government to reserve the remnant of our public lands for purposes of afforestation and to take measures to encourage the farmers of the Province to protect and increase the proportion of their woodlands, to plant wind breaks, hedgerows and clumps of trees about their steadings and thus beautify, enrich and render more pleasurable life amongst us.

At the conclusion of the paper Prof. Macoun expressed himself as highly pleased with the magnificent paper read by Father Burke. Before hearing the paper he was under the impression that greater space was reserved for wooded land in Ontario where forests are scattered the streams dry up and the crops are not nearly as good. The protecting of trees helps to retain snow and this protects plant life which is such an important item. He then dealt at length with the agitation for the preservation of the forest. He also drew attention to the Canadian Foresters' Association and advised those present to become members of the Association by the payment of a one dollar fee.

Mr. Edward Bayfield after complimenting Father Burke upon the thoughtful paper read, thought that perhaps it did not go far enough. Nearly all the forest land in this Province is owned by private individuals. With regard to the retaining of moisture he thought the present summers are more damp than in years past and it was not necessary to talk about retaining trees on that score. He had some experience with shade trees and he found that they impoverished the soil surrounding the trees on the outskirts of his orchard, and of course impoverished the trees and the quality of the fruit.

Father Burke thought that if the Crown lands were allowed to grow up in forests it would eventually be a great benefit to the country. There are a large number of acres of land now in the possession of the Government that are almost valueless to the Province in their present condition, but if properly cared for could be made valuable.

Mr. J. S. Clarke referred at length to the revenue derived by other countries from the proper care of the forest.

Mr. John Robertson would like to see the government passing a law to protect those who would plant trees along the roadside. He was strongly in favor of ornamenting the fronts of farms with ornamental trees. At the present time farmers who ornament the front of their farms are subject to the road supervisor. In the province of Ontario the farmers and owners of lands are encouraged by the Government and are relieved of their statute labor if they plant so many trees and beautify the roads in front of their farms.

Mr. James J. McCallum agreed with Mr. Bayfield in regard to the climate and also agreed with Father Burke. At the present time this Province is reaping the fruits of a fire which swept the country about 40 years ago and which destroyed the older growth.

disputing the fact that the dry air which crosses the field has a great influence upon the crop. He believed that in the preservation of the forests the same education of the people must occur. Upon being asked for an opinion as to the best kind of tree Prof. Macoun said that the Norway spruce is largely used in Ontario for shelter belts. The growth of Norway spruce is very rapid. Of course in placing a shade belt the exposed side of the orchard should receive the protection.

Mr. Joseph Wise thought that the adoption of a shelter belt is a good thing, but he was of the opinion that if many kinds of trees are used, insects are attached and a great deal of harm is a result.

Premier Farquharson in answer to the question of how much land is owned by the Government said that there is a prevailing idea of securing forest for wood purposes. The Government had, however, lost more than could be imagined in the neglect of horticulture. He had met with Hon. Sydney Fisher and Prof. Robertson a few days ago, and he was of the opinion there are great things in store for the people of this Province. He asked that the Association would submit any points in the form of a resolution to the Government and he would bring it up for consideration.

Hon. Benj. Rogers, Minister of Agriculture, was present and took part in the discussion. He expressed himself as doubtful about the suggestion made by Mr. Robertson. It has frequently occurred that owing to the retaining of snow on the public highways, the removal of trees has been demanded.

Mr. Walter Simpson condemned the use of spruce on the sides of the roads. He also deplored the narrowing up of the roads as was the case in many parts of the Province.

Mr. John Newson endorsed all that had been said by Father Burke. He did not think that forests attract more moisture from the clouds but the forest certainly aids in holding the moisture, which has fallen. He was of the opinion that black walnut could be grown to advantage in this province and it would certainly be a paying investment. Father Burke's paper was then discussed by Mr. John F. Baker, Jas. Guard, A. Moore and others.

A vote of thanks was then tendered Father Burke.

Prof. Macoun followed speaking of fruit growing. Owing to the storm in the evening the program was not carried out. Prof. Robertson gave a short talk to the few who had gathered.
