WITH REGARD TO THE BALLOT

It would be a source of great satisfaction to The Guardian if the Legislature at its present session would by unanimous vote adopt an amendment to the election law which would introduce the ballot in our provincial elections, and we fail to find any good reason why this cannot be brought about.

The ballot has been in use in Federal elections since 1874, a period of 36 years. Longer than that, it has been in use in the Provinces of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Ontario in their provincial and municipal elections.

In the face of these multiplied examples of the acquired use of the ballot, working satisfactorily in every case, it is surely difficult to make out that the people do not want the ballot.

LOCALISED OPPOSITION—A GREAT MAN'S MISTAKE.

The strong opposition to reciprocity appears to have developed principally in the Province of Ontario, the city of Montreal, the city of Winnipeg and in British Columbia.

From this general statement it would appear that the strength of the opposition to the agreement outside of the manufacturing centre of Montreal is confined to those Provinces which have Conservative Governments—Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia, while Manitoba, outside of Winnipeg must be regarded as favorable to reciprocity.

It is interesting at a time when ruin and disaster are being predicted to follow in the wake of the agreement, to recall the deliverance of Sir

The proposal for a driveway along the north side of Victoria Park and parallel to Brighton Road, as recently outlined in these columns, is meeting with most hearty and enthusiastic support, quite beyond any civic improvement in recent years.

The Toronto Globe publishes a telegram from Brandon, the chief town of Mr. Sifton's constituency, stating that the Liberal Association there, after three hours' deliberation, adopted a resolution endorsing the reciprocity agreement, but leaving Mr. Sifton, as member for Brandon, free to pursue such a policy as his own convictions may dictate.

James A. Teller, an Ontario sheep farmer, has purchased 750 acres of land on the hills back of Sussex, N. B., and expects to soon have thereon five hundred sheep. He declares that no land in Canada is better adapted to sheep raising than the Maritime Provinces. The East will yet come into its own. And therein is also a hint to our Island sheep-raisers.

In view of the fact that Congress had failed to sanction the reciprocity agreement, Mr. Borden, in the House of Commons at Ottawa on Wednesday moved to postpone its further consideration by Parliament. The motion was rejected by a majority of

were left untrammelled by party and free to vote according to his rational convictions.

And what are the objections to the ballot in provincial elections more than in a fraternal society, a joint stock company, a town or city, or in a federal election? None whatever. But an objection is found in the fact that a ballot law, coupled with a cumbersome, unnecessary and costly system of registration, was long ago repealed by the Conservatives when they were in power.

Men of both parties in the Legislature are equally bound to promote good measures, without regard to past mistakes or errors of themselves or their political opponents. For once let by-gones be by-gones. "Let the dead past bury its dead." The ballot system is good in theory and in practice, as has been demonstrated throughout the civilized world. It has been tried by long experience and not found wanting.

Charles Tupper in opposition to the British preference when it was introduced by Mr. Fielding in connection with the tariff of 1897. Sir Charles was and is an able statesman, held in high honor for his ability and patriotism, but he was sometimes mistaken. On the occasion referred to he said, in part:

"The result is that this (Fielding) tariff goes into operation and the honorable gentleman knows that the industries of this country are already paralyzed in consequence, while honorable members gloat over the destruction of Canadian industries. I was reading the wall, the sorrowful wall, of these industries in the Montreal Gazette, where one manufacturer after another declared that their industries were ruined, that their mills must close, and that they saw staring them in the face a return to the deplorable state of things that existed when the honorable gentleman who last addressed the House was in charge of the fiscal affairs of this country. I say that a deeper wrong was never inflicted upon Canada. I feel, that, so far from rejoicing at it from a party standpoint, I deplore from the bottom of my heart the ruin that is going to be inflicted upon the best interests of Canada and upon its great industries."

These things would have been deplorable had they come to pass, but that did not happen. The same thing seems likely now to prove true of the prophecies of blue ruin to result from reciprocity.

It is the policy of the Government to ratify the agreement at this session, with a suspending clause providing that it shall not go into effect until sanctioned by the American Congress.

St. John is busy with large and important new projects. One is the new terminals for the Grand Trunk Pacific and the creation of a new harbor at Courtney Bay on the east side of the city. Another is a two million dollar sugar refinery, surveys for the foundation of which are now begun. A third is a cement factory with a capacity of 1200 barrels a day, to be located above the Reversing Falls. A fourth is the beautifying of the city by planting trees and shrubs on an extensive scale. And still another project is the adoption of the commission plan of city government. This is to be voted upon by the citizens on April 17 and will probably go into effect.
