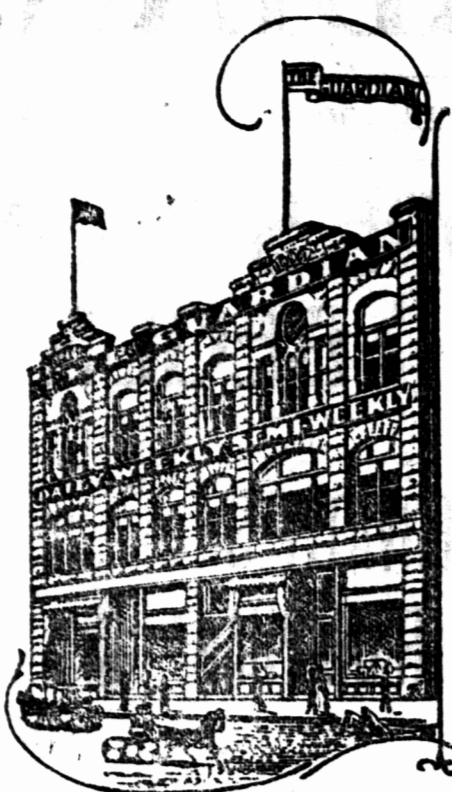

SPEEDY JUSTICE, VERSUS DELAY.

There is about as strong a contrast between the methods of criminal justice in the British Isles and in the United States as there is between the political systems of the two nations. In the Moat House murder case the body of the murdered woman was found and identified on April 27th, of this year, nearly four years after her disappearance. The indictment, and arraignment of the accused followed in due order, the trial occupying one day, and exactly three weeks after he was convicted the murderer was hanged. And this is a typical rather than a remarkable case so far as the speed and certainty of justice are concerned in Great Britain. The trial was, of course conspicuous because of the sensational character of the crime, but otherwise the usual course of procedure in criminal cases was followed. All who are in any way familiar with criminal trials in the United States are aware of the tardiness, delays and uncertainty which characterize them.

This contrast is painfully apparent to the thinking classes of the American people and to their public writers, who remark upon it. The New York Times puts the case so strongly as to assert that "in this matter of the administration of criminal justice the United States is the least civilized of the civilized countries of the world and New York the least civilized of the United States." This is because the defendant in criminal cases, if he has money enough to hire a lawyer, can after conviction have his case carried from court to court and from one judge to another, and at the worst can protract for years the delay of his final punishment, with every verse of the chapter of accidents in his favor. And these delays of justice which amount to a denial of justice, have so lessened the confidence of the masses in the regular administration of the law as to be the fruitful cause of mob violence to accused or suspected persons. In cases of atrocious crime that fires the public indignation even law-abiding citizens join in lynching simply because they have no confidence that the criminal will be punished by the legally constituted tribunals.
