 ...A RECORD.—Probably the largest liver ever seen on these shores was found in a codfish caught by Mr. John J. Robertson, Basin Head on Saturday last. The liver measured thirty inches long with two forks eighteen and nineteen inches each respectively. It weighed 20 1/2 pounds.

...PLANTING.—About 70 p. c. of the potatoes are planted, and 60 p. c. of the seeding is done in eastern King's County. The grass is suffering from the cool weather and want of warm rain, and has been practically at a stand still for the past three weeks. Farmers should go easy on their old hay and straw as they had a good crop last year.

...AN INDUSTRY.—Mr. R. D. McEwen, Morrell, was in the Baltic recently in connection with the subscription of nineteen thousand bushels of potatoes for delivery to his starch factory there this fall. A hearty response was the result, when nearly the entire amount was subscribed. The contract price for this seasons potatoes will be 33 cts. per bushel. It was stated that this price is 3 cents better than any other factory on the Island as the soil here is adapted for raising a better grade of potatoes for starch purposes than elsewhere, including Ireland. This fact should not be lost sight of by the Eastern King's farmer.

The new liner is truly a leviathan of the deep. Nine hundred and fifty feet in length, she is a third longer than the Minnesota which James J. Hill launched 10 years ago and which was then the largest in the world. Five such ships, placed end to end would stretch almost a mile.

Her width is 100 feet, her searchlight of 80,000 candlepower will be visible for 30 miles and will light up an object seven miles away.

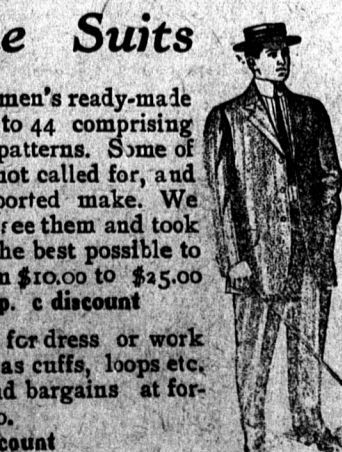
