THE CZAR AS A REFORMER.

Nicholas II, Autocrat of all the Russias is credited with being a kind-hearted man, but prevented by the bureaucracy which surrounds him from bestowing upon his subjects the many administrative reforms that are so urgently called for.

The system of exile had its origin amid the barbarities of the seventeenth century. Strange to say it was at the time hailed by the people as a relief. The Russian criminal code of that age was almost incredibly cruel. Men were impaled on sharp stakes, hanged or beheaded for crimes that would now be regarded as trivial in any civilized country.

But the exile system was in its turn horribly abused, and the abuses have extended down to the present day. Political suspects were denied trial by the courts. It was sufficient that the suspect was charged with being "prejudicial to public order," or "disturbing to public tranquillity" and he would be arrested by the secret police, without warrant, very probably denied a hearing, or even a statement of the charges against him, shut up in prison for a week or for years and then deported to Siberia.

In the years 1873-87 the exiles deported to Siberia averaged 18,000 a year. The yearly rate is believed not to have diminished since 1887 although the exact figures are not available. Within a century more than a million, mostly of men in the prime of life, have been banished to Siberia, there to toil and die, shut off from all communication with their kindred.

Now this is to be changed so far that all accused persons will be tried by the courts. There will be some form of trial at least. Men will no longer be sent to a life of exile on mere suspicion without knowing what they are charged with. This will be a great change for the better. But Russian courts are not like ours, independent of the executive authority. The Judges hold office at the pleasure of the Czar and the Council of State and are usually subservient thereto.

It will still fare ill with the prisoner whom the prosecuting authorities desire to have condemned. Liberty as we know it will still be unknown in Russia till much greater reforms than these are conceded.
