—The latest news, first of all.

—It is pleasing to learn that the Rural Mail delivery in Wilnot is increasing rapidly. Robert Stavert and John Hogg have recently been added to the list.

—Rev. F. N. and Mrs. Webster, Summerside, have the sympathy of their many friends on the death of their infant son, which took place on Saturday last.

—The death occurred at Miscouche on Tuesday last of Jos. S. Gaudet, a highly respected citizen of that place. Deceased was 71 years of age. The funeral took place on Thursday and was largely attended.

—Thanks to Inspector Wheat, Charlottetown, the delayed mails and passengers, which arrived in Georgetown too late to connect with the western train, arrived in Summerside by special train about eleven o'clock Saturday night.

—Three Prohibition cases were up before Stip. Tweedy at Alberton on Saturday viz James Adams of Lot 10 Alonzo Thompson, Bloomfield and David Betts of Bloomfield. The latter was fined one hundred dollars and costs, the others being dismissed owing to lack of evidence against the act. The cases were conducted by Prosecutor Doyle with Charles Burke Elmsdale as constable.

—The road from Reads Corner to Summerside, is reported in a very bad condition, in some places very dangerous, owing to the amount of snow and water on it. A prominent merchant of Summerside who returned yesterday, after driving from Grand and back says, that this road is the worst he found on his trip. As this road is practically the only entrance to Summerside from the east, after the roads on the ice are unfit for travel, the inspector for this district, should see that this road is put in a possible condition at once.

—Many friends and relatives will regret to hear of the death of Nathan Ramsay, which sad event occurred at Coleman on Saturday March 6th at the advanced age of eighty-six years. Deceased had been a sufferer for over a year, but despite all the care that kind and loving hands could bestow, death came at an early hour to release him of his sufferings, and his spirit took its homeward flight.
