## S. S. To Newfoundland

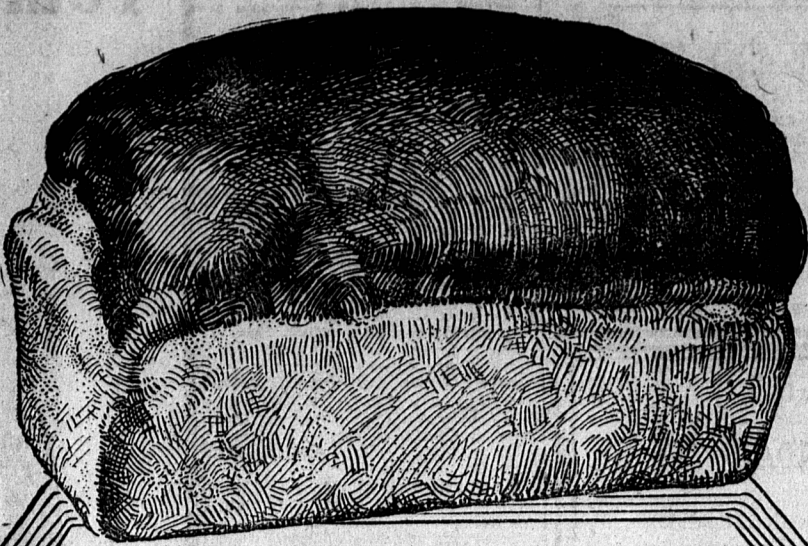

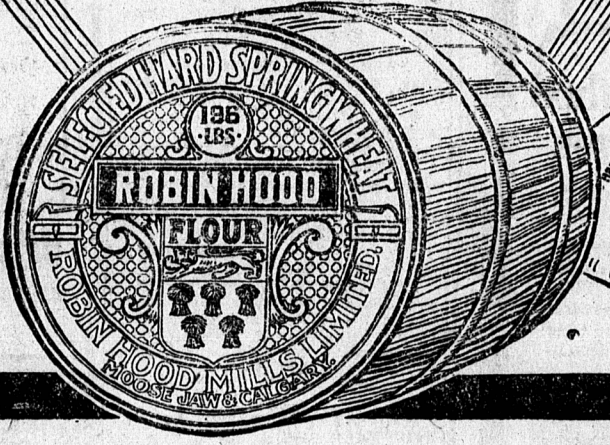
